

# Lawyer Takes Verbal Poke At Cards On Wilson Case

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP)—A lawyer promised Saturday to answer before May 30 a petition by the Chicago Cardinals National Football League team for an injunction to bar Jerry Wilson from playing for a Western Canada team.

The lawyer, Rush Lester, also took a verbal poke at the Chicago team, saying "the Cardinals are asking at straws in this case." Wilson has a contract to play with Edmonton Edmonson of the western Interprovincial Football Union. No date has been set for trying the petition pending receipt of Wilson's answer.

Wilson is a star Auburn College athlete who finishes his studies in spring.

ADVANCED \$1,000

The Cardinals claim he is their property on the strength of a verbal agreement and the fact that he advanced him \$1,000.

Wilson said there is no written contract and that he doesn't consider an oral agreement binding. He said he returned the \$1,000.

"Jerry Wilson has signed a contract with Edmonton and he'll be here," said Lester. "We're prepared to fight all the way. I can see why they're desperate to get him. If anybody needs players, it's the Cardinals. But Jerry has signed a contract. He'll honor it."

# Braves Regain Top Spot; Dodgers Edge Giants 3-2

Milwaukee Braves regained first place in the National League Sunday by taking two from Cincinnati while Chicago moved within 1 1/2 games of the American League lead by sweeping a double-header from Cleveland.

Hank Aaron's ninth-inning single gave the Braves the second game over Cincinnati 2-1 after the Braves bombed Red pitching in the opener 12-4, scoring seven runs in the eighth.

Clem Labine saved the day for Los Angeles with a neat relief job for the Dodgers in a 3-2 victory over San Francisco. It was the second day in succession that Labine had clicked.

Philadelphia handed Bob Friend his sixth straight setback 6-3 and Pittsburgh had to settle for a 6-4 lead in the last of the eighth inning of the second game when the curfew intervened. It will be completed July 21.

CARDS WIN A PAIR

St. Louis claimed its first series of the season, splitting a doubleheader with Chicago. The Cubs took the opener in 11 innings 10-9 on Earl Averill's homer. Gino Cimoli and Curt Flood teamed up to pull the second out of the fire in the ninth for an 8-7 St. Louis victory. The Cards had a 3-2 edge in the five-game series.

Billy Pierce staggered through, winning a 13-hitter, 5-4 in 11 innings and Early Wynn pitched a four-hit 5-0 shutout as Chicago swept two from Cleveland in the American. Bubba Phillips, whose homer tied the score in the eighth, won the first game with an 11th-inning single. Wynn was in charge all the way.

Detroit made it seven victories in eight starts under Jimmy Dykes, beating Kansas City 7-6. The Tigers used homers by Lou Berberet, Charlie Maxwell and Rocky Bridges to beat the A's despite a pair by Roger Maris. Paul Foytack won his first with relief help. The defeat was charged to Ralph Terry.

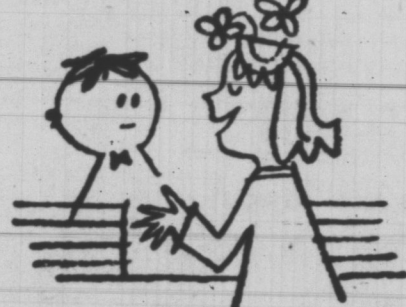

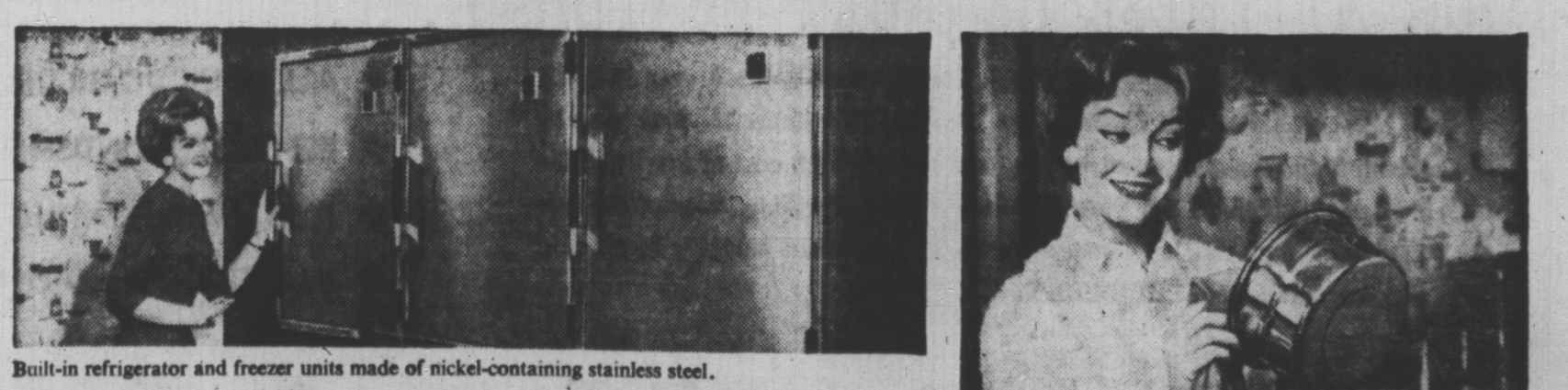
