Old-Age Security Plan Discussed

OTTAWA, May 16 — (CP) — Representatives of the Trades and Labor Congress said today that if a universal contributory old-age pension plan was adopted in Canada private pension schemes probably would disappear.

In testimony before the parliamentary committee on old-age security, the representatives said that the 500,000-member congress is opposed to private pension plans where contributions are required of employees. The congress "condemned" private plans but did not favor them. It wanted to see a universal plan covering everyone in Canada regardless of income.

The representatives were Gordon G. Cushing, secretary-treasurer, and Leslie Wismer, director of research. They appeared before the committee to answer questions on a T. L. C. brief submitted to the committee and made public about two weeks ago. The brief urged adoption of a contributory pension plan that would provide \$60 a month for men at 65 and for women at 60 regardless of means. Such a plan, said the representatives, would probably put an end to demands for private pension plans.

The T. L. C. estimated such a pension would cost about \$720,000,000 a year and suggested that 80 per cent of the amount be paid through contributions collected with the income tax by the revenue department. The remaining 20 per cent would be paid out of the public treasury.

The congress believed that a six-per-cent assessment on the national income would provide 80 per cent of the amount needed to finance the plan.

The keel laid today was for the first of four trawlers to be built according to designs by the Ottawa Departments of Fisheries and National Defence.

The first trawler will be finished next May.
