JOHN FREEMAN AFFLECK

John Freeman Affleck age 44 of Mount Stewart, an employee of the Maritime Electric Company, died as the result of an accident in the village of Stanley Bridge.

The funeral was held Sunday afternoon Decem^r 1st, from the residence of his father Alfred J. Affleck to St. John's United Church, where the service was conducted by his minister Rev. John M. Sheen. The Hymns sung were "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "Abide With Me". Miss Barbara Coffin sang a solo, "There is no Night There". The minister brought a message from the text of Hebrews 9 verses 27-28 "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment; So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation."

The late Mr. Affleck was a veteran of World War Two, he served in Canada and overseas with the Signal Corps. On discharge he held the rank of sergeant.

Interment was in the Mount Stewart cemetery. Pallbearers were Bruce Affleck, Warren McGuirk, Francis MacDonald, Aeneas MacDonald, Arthur Mitchell, Peter MacLeod. At the grave the Canadian Legion burial service was read by Colin MacDonald. A firing party under command of Sergeant F.A. Walsh was also in attendance. The Last Post and Reveille were sounded by Bugler David Mills.

IN MEMORIAM

REGINALD J. KELLY

The citizens of Stanchel, Kelly's Cross, and throughout the province in general were shocked and deeply saddened when, on the night of Oct. 31, 1957, they learned of the very sudden and untimely passing of Reginald Kelly which occurred almost instantaneously and without any warning at his home in Stanchel.

The deceased who was in his forty-fifth year had been in his usual good health almost up to the very moment of his sudden passing. On that day, not feeling well and believing he was contracting the current epidemic of flu did not go to his labours as usual. During the day his condition did not appear to be serious and all seemed well until a short time after he retired for the night.

Sensing that something was wrong, his wife found upon closer examination that he had passed into unconsciousness. She quickly gave the alarm and through the help of good neighbours, medical aid was hastily summoned as was his pastor and spiritual director, the Rev. James Smith P.P. of Kelly's Cross. He passed away before medical aid reached him, fortified by the rites of the Roman Catholic Church of which he had always been a faithful member. "Reg" as he was familiarly known was of a jovial disposition and was a general favourite of young and old. As one of his good friends remarked, while gazing on his remains, "He had a smile for everyone".

He was the son of the late John Kelly and Maria Hogan, and was born and lived all his life in Stanchel, where in his early youth he attended the district school.

In 1940 he married Mildred Cusack from the neighbouring parish of St. Ann's, Lot 65. He had acquired a small farm holding in his native district where he carried on farming to some extent; but his chief work was trucking in which his many obnoxious qualities stood him in good stead, and so in his chosen occupation he was eminently successful.

In his work which through time took him to practically every part of the Island he naturally became very well known to a great majority of the citizens of this province.

That he was very well known and also that he was respected and admired by all his many friends and acquaintances was clearly demonstrated on the day of his funeral procession seen in a rural district for many years. The graves were performed by the pastor, Rev. Fr. Smith. Present also were Rev. Wilfred Keefe P.P. of Rollo Bay and Rev. Charles McCarthy of St. Ann's, Lot 65.

The pallbearers were Messrs James Nicholson, Albert Todd, William Cameron, Louis Hogan, Clarence Curley and Percy Woods. The funeral Mass was sung on Monday morning Nov. 4th by the Pastor Rev. Fr. Smith at which a large number of friends and neighbours were again present.

Besides his sorrowing widow, the deceased leaves two sons and two daughters, who mourn the loss of a kind and loving father and husband. They are Gerald, age 13, Paul 11, Joan 10, Clare 9. Also left to mourn are his mother, Mrs. Maria Kelly, two brothers, Earle of New Wiltshire

and Richard of Stanchel sister Elsie (Mrs. Byrne) of Ottawa.
