ing pastry rectangle Seal edges together. Decorate with rolled out fancy - cut pastry trimmings. Bake in 350 degree F. (mod.) oven 1/2 hr. Combine egg with water; brush top of loaf to form glaze. Bake 1 hr. longer, brushing occasionally with egg. Remove from oven; cool 10 min. Unmold on serving platter; refrigerate 6 hr. or overnight. Garnish with lemon slices, olive and parsley.

To Parboil Calf Liver (Skinned and Sliced): Combine 1 small peeled onion, halved, 10 peppercorns, 2 whole cloves, 1 bay leaf, 1/2 tsp. salt and 1 qt. water. Bring to boil. Add liver; boil 2 min. and put twice through food-chopper.

Bake 30 min. in mod. oven, 350 degrees F or until browned. Unmold on heated platter. Spoon 1/2 c. chili sauce down center, making a stripe 2" wide. Garnish with onion rings; border with green beans and green peas, et voila! A glamorous entree platter is ready to serve elevated out of competition into with hot garlic French bread. Chilled Avocado Soup in Cups

Pate en Croute (Exquisite Meat-Filbert Pate in Pastry Crust)

California Strawberries Marinated in Champagne Or in Sparkling White Grape Juice

Measurements level; recipes for 12

PATE EN CROUTE
1/2 c. sliced peeled shallots
1 tsp. butter
1 lb. calf liver, parboiled (recipe follows)
1 lb. each, twice-ground veal and pork

1/2 c. fine-chopped filberts
1/2 c. heavy cream
2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. monosodium
1/2 tsp. pepper
1/4 tsp. each: garlic powder, ground sage, ground thyme

1 recipe rich flaky pastry (to be columned Monday,) use odds from trimmings

1 can (3/4 oz.) black truffles, or sliced ripe olives

1 egg, slightly beaten
1 tsp. water

Garnish: 4 lemon slices, 8 ripe olive slices, 8 parsley sprigs

Saute shallots in butter; mix with liver, veal, pork, filberts cream and seasonings. Roll 3/4 of pastry into 14" x 10" rectangle. Line 9" x 5" loaf pan with pastry leaving 1/2" above pan-edge. Roll remaining pastry into 11" x 7" rectangle, 1/4" thick to use for top crust.

Press 1-3 meat mixture into lined pan; dot with 1-3 of truffles or sliced black olives. Repeat twice. Top with remain-
