Senator Inman Is Seventh To Take Oath Of Office

OTTAWA, (Special) — Sole woman to be called to the Senate for the 1956 session, Senator Elsie Inman of Montague was one of the 13 new members of the Upper House sworn in at a special sitting of the chamber at 10:30 o'clock Tuesday morning.

Seventh of the number to take the oath of allegiance and that of membership in the senate of Canada, Senator Inman was escorted from the outer section of the house beyond the bar to the clerks table by solicitor-general Ross MacDonal and Senator J. P. McIntyre of Mount Stewart, P. E. I. She assented to the oath as read by Col. R. Larose and repeated and brief second oath administered by J. F. MacNeill, Q.C., clerk of the Senate. Those in the senate galleries at the time remarked that Mrs. Inman was letter-perfect in oath neither hesitating nor stumbling as some of her colleagues did.

At the administering of oaths, Mrs. Inman chose a smartly-tailored suit of dark blue with accessories to match and wore a cor-
