

Milt Sees 'Hungry' Bruins As Threat In Playoffs

NEW YORK (AP) — Because the team is "hungry" and there is \$54,000 to be won, coach Milt Schmidt thinks his Boston Bruins can go a long way in the Stanley Cup playoffs.

In each of the last two seasons, the Bruins advanced to the cup final in the National Hockey League only to lose to Montreal Canadiens.

The Montrealers can break a league record by winning their fourth straight cup series this year.

"Anything can happen in a short series," said Schmidt. "Sure, Canadiens are anxious to win, especially with the record on the line. But the three other teams in the playoffs will be just as determined to see that they don't."

NO PREDICTIONS, BUT . . .

"I don't want to make any rash predictions. Let's just say that the way we've been going the team stands a good chance."

The Bruins, perennial strong finishers, have won six and tied one in their last seven games. They clinched second place last night by defeating slumping New York Rangers 5-3.

The Bruins have compiled their unbeaten string with a substitute goalie, veteran Harry Lumley. He was recalled from Providence Reds of the American League when Don Simmons, Boston's regular netminder, underwent an appendectomy three weeks ago.

Macs Won't Be Home Till April

TORONTO (CP) — Canada's world championship hockey team from Belleville won't be home from Europe until April 1.

Pan American Airways, which announced Monday the team was flying home next Sunday, reported Thursday that was all a mistake. Space it cleared on a jet flight next Sunday from London is for a group of Belleville supporters.

The team itself will sail from Southampton Thursday, March 26, on the Queen Elizabeth, arriving in New York March 31. It is due in Belleville at 2:30 p.m. April 1.

Yolande Pompey Must Retire

PAISLEY, Scotland (AP) — Trinidad's Yolande Pompey, who once fought for the light heavyweight title, was reported in "satisfactory condition" Thursday following a knockout Wednesday night.

The 29-year-old boxer was taken to a hospital after he was knocked out in the final seconds of a 10-round bout with Scottish champion Chick Calderwood.

"I don't think there is any immediate danger," a hospital spokesman said after Pompey was given a thorough examination.

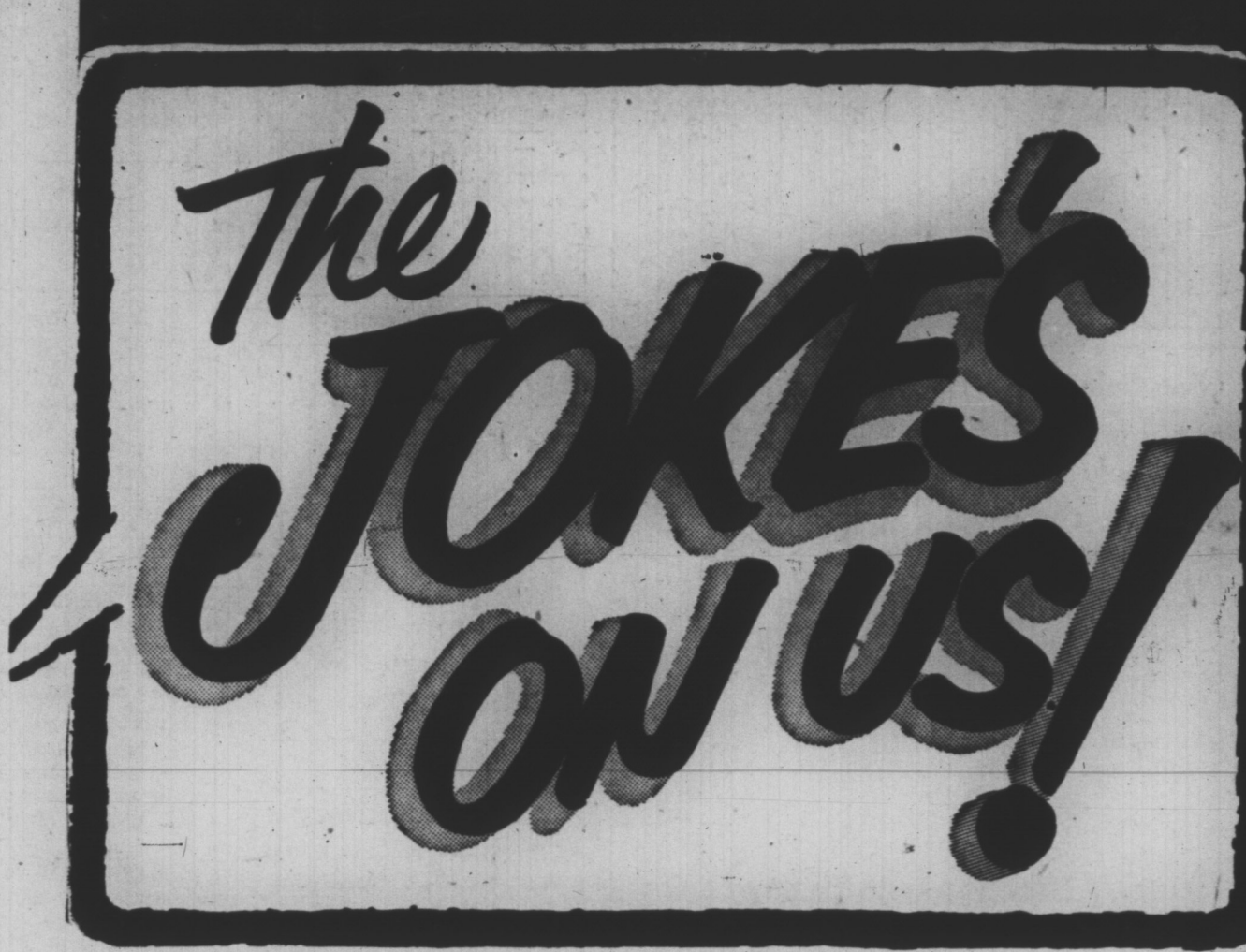

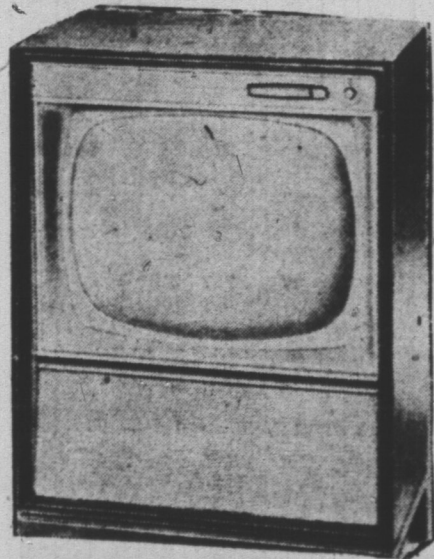
