LLOYD'S Register of British and Foreign Shipping.

Having been represented to the Committee that much inconvenience and loss will be incurred by the Ship-builders in the British North American Colonies, if the Regulation passed on the 15th May last, "That on and after the 1st July, 1857, Ships which proceed to sea without being fastened with the Iron Knees and Riders prescribed by the Rules, will have one year deducted from the period to which they would otherwise be entitled to be classed in the Register Book;" the Committee have resolved to amend the said Regulation, so that the view to obviate, as far as practicable, the inconvenience complained of, arising from the difficulty at present experienced in obtaining the Iron Knees and Riders required, it has been this day resolved to postpone the application of the Regulation above quoted until the 1st January, 1858, after which time its provisions will be strictly enforced.
