### Woman Bullfighter Weds Lion Hunter

LISBON, Nov. 5 — (CP) — A young woman bullfighter with 800 slain bulls to her credit was married today to a lion-hunter of noble lineage. Crowds of adoring aficionados turned out in pouring rain to cheer the event. The bride is 28-year-old Con-

suela Cintron Verrill—known to her fans as Conchita Cintron. The groom is Dom Francisco Dacamara Decastelo Branco of the titled Pombreiro family. Conchita drove her own American-made car to the chapel. With her was her hairdresser, who spent three hours doing her hair for the nuptials. Conchita's admirers saw her in the frilly costume of a blushing bride instead of the colorful garb of the bullfight. She wore a gown of white silk, a veil and orange

blossoms. A long train was carried by eight young train-bearers clad in blue and wearing crowns of flowers. Conchita is giving up bullfighting to become a housewife. She was only 13 years old when she started fighting bulls in Lima, Peru, tutored by an exiled Portuguese. She has fought in every country where bullfighting is allowed, and has millions of fans who call her "May Senorita," the Spanish equivalent of "what a gal."

### Announce Quebec Senior Hockey League Statistics

MONTREAL, Nov. 6 — (CP) — Players from the first-place Valleyfield Braves of the Quebec Senior Hockey League hold down three of the first five spots in the individual scoring race, league statistics showed today.

### P.E.I. Yorkshires Score In Alberta

Island Yorkshires were among the outstanding successes at the Alberta Swine Show and Sale held recently in Edmonton, reported Mr. H. W. Clay, Senior Livestock Fieldman with the Dominion Department of Agriculture yesterday.

J. A. Innis of Ogden, Alta., showed the champion boar, reserve champion boar, and the Sinclair Trophy for the best two boars. The Innis entries are the progeny of straight Island stock purchased in the Province from Almon Boswell, K. Heath McLeod and Alan Hamilton. To continue this line of breeding, Mr. Innis has recently purchased a breeding age boar from Stirling Willis of Kingston.

It will be of interest to Island swine breeders to know that Frank McInnis of Cherry Valley has purchased the boar Stewart SSE from S. C. Stewart and Son, Dunstaffnage. This boar won the grand championship a few days ago at the Maritime Winter Fair. The sale of Woodstock Duke 40F, winner in his class at Amherst, to Percy Switzer of St. Mary's, Ont., was made by Almon Boswell of Marshfield, who also sold his second prize boar to D. L. Harrington of Lachute, Que., and Roland Paynter of French River, who won first at Amherst in the boar class under 12 months, sold this boar to the Oka Agricultural College, Quebec.

### Canadian Dog-Owner Saves Dying Breed

LONDON, Nov. 5 — Two years ago there were fewer than a dozen mastiffs in Britain—the famous breed discovered in this country by the Romans, was dying out.

Then, answering an appeal from the Old English Mastiff Club, a Canadian breeder, Mrs. Hyacinth M. Mellish, of Victoria, British Columbia, sent over free of charge a thoroughbred dog and bitch, her only request being: "Let me have two back when you have started successful breeding."

Today the first of the two will leave by Trans-Canada Airlines for Canada. The second goes tomorrow. Each animal—a dog and a bitch—is valued at \$120 and they weigh about 110 lbs. Mr. Frederick J. Hawkins, a member of the committee of the Mastiff Club, said last night: "Except for one which was sent a few weeks ago to the United States, no mastiff has been exported since 1940. Mrs. Mellish came to our assistance in a most generous manner. At that time there were fewer than 12 mastiffs in the country, and most of these were too old for breeding. We have done much to restore the breed."

Throughout the centuries mastiffs have especially been bred by particular families, one such being the Leghs of Lime Hall, Cheshire, whose coat of arms is supported by "Two Mastiffs Proper, Collared Sable."

Sir Piers Legh had a mastiff bitch with him at the Battle of Agincourt, October 25, 1415, and when wounded was guarded by her.

### No Trace Of Wanted Men

MONTREAL, Nov. 6 — (CP) — Police said today they had checked without results two reports of the presence of two men in Montreal wanted in the Maritimes on suspicion of murder and for a racket in forged cheques.

Calls last night from the area of Sherbrooke and St. Hubert Streets sent police cruisers on a search that continued until early today. No trace was found of a blue car, said to have been driven by the men from New Brunswick. The two men are said to be heavily armed, and there was a report they had been joined by a third man.

R. C. M. P. and city police would not reveal the names of the wanted men but said they had been operating a forged-cheque racket in the Maritimes in recent months.

Discovery of a body recently in the St. John River near Fredericton has led police to believe he may have been the third of the original trio.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 6 — (CP) — Prices showed a strong tone today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange, reflecting aggressive commercial demand which found offerings light.

Many seasonal highs were recorded in the moderately active session. Shipping problems and the halt of harvesting were factors in the trade.

Export loadings of Canadian wheat included 1,600,000 bushels to the United Kingdom, 350,000 to the Netherlands, 370,000 to Italy, 340,000 to Germany, 280,000 to India, 254,000 to Denmark, 160,000 to Japan, 30,000 to the republic of Ireland, 37,000 to Colombia and a small cargo to Switzerland.
