Gladys MacDonald, Baltic, is spending some time with her sister Mrs. Bernie Hynes and Mr. Hynes of North Granville.

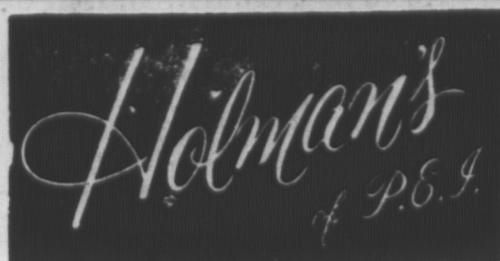
Mrs. Bertram Stewart of Hamilton is a patient in Prince County Hospital.
