Weston Increases Stock Holdings

TORONTO (CP)—The Telegram says that W. Garfield Weston, Canadian-born British industrialist, has increased his stock holdings in two of North America's biggest food chain stores in a \$6,500,000 deal. The financial page story said Saturday Mr. Weston recently increased his interests in Loblaw Groceries Company, a Canadian firm, and Loblaw Inc. of Buffalo. The story says Mr. Weston "apparently completed a \$3,900,000 deal to increase his control in Loblaw Groceries to some 62 per cent of the voting stock."

"The second deal is said to give Mr. Weston control of 49 per cent of the common stock of Loblaw Incorporated, a U. S. chain of some 133 stores. In this transaction he is reported to have acquired some 86,000 shares held by the late F. K. Morrow to boost his interest to about 175,000 of the 351,492 shares outstanding."

Argentine Seeks Farm Machinery

BUENOS AIRES (AP) - The Argentine central bank announced Saturday more than \$66,000,000 has been allotted to buy tractors and other farm machinery. Companies representing manufacturers in the United States, Canada, Germany, Austria, France, Italy, United Kingdom, Sweden and Switzerland may apply for import permits under allocation system.

Korean Truce Ace Topic On Stock Market

NEW YORK (AP)—The Korean truce was the ace topic in the stock market last week. It was the final gauge against which prudent traders measured their purchases and sales. The stock market in the past three years has been severely shaken by Korean developments that everyone is saying. So many times in the last three years a sharp shakeout in the market has discounted a cease fire, and just as many times the market has risen to go through the same process all over again.

The trading pace last week was a slow crawl. The daily average volume was 894,000. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks lost 50 cents on the week, the second weekly decline after four straight weekly advances. Brokers were quick to point out that dull markets following a decline, such as experienced earlier this year, have in the past been followed by higher prices. If the historic precedent holds true in the present case, the stock market is in for a rise.

The entire background of economic news was good all week. Company statements continued to show high profits. Dividends in almost all cases were favorable. Canadian issues finished the week on a downward trend. McIntyre led the Canadian issues lower, off 1-3 Canadian Pacific, Domes Mines and International Nickel all were down 1-8 in Friday's trading.

However, Canadian issues on the American Stock Exchange generally finished higher. Lake Shore and Giant Yellowknife both gained 1-8 Friday but Royalite Oil was off 1-4.

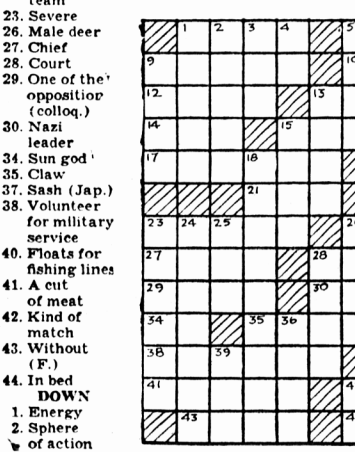

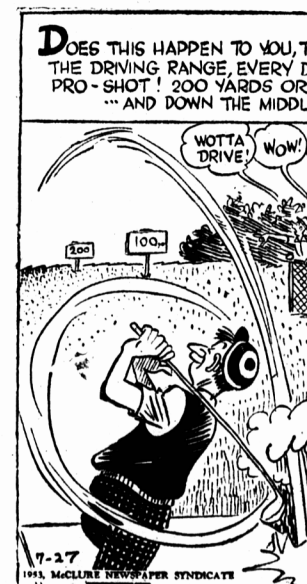
