Jean-Louis Daulne: *onomatOpoia* at Mackenzie

The Confederation Centre of the Arts, in collaboration with Le Carrefour de l'Isle-Saint-Jean, presents "Jean-Louis Daulne: *onomatOpoia*" on February 6, 1998, at 8:00 p.m. in the Mackenzie Theatre of the Confederation Centre of the Arts. Daulne's recent album, entitled "*onomatOpoia*," features a musical style with strong African and jazz influence combining voice, natural sounds and rhythms. Daulne uses his body to produce music earning him the moniker "the orchestra man." This is Jean-Louis' first time performing in Prince Edward Island.

Singer, songwriter Jean-Louis Daulne won Le Prix Québec Wallonie-Bruxelles this past summer for his album, *onomatOpoia*. It was presented during Les FrancoFolies, a prestigious international music festival held annually in Montréal. The critics say that Jean-Louis Daulne was also the hit of La FrancoFête 1997, held in Moncton last November.

Confederation Centre of the Arts Executive Director and CEO Curtis Barlow says Island audiences will not want to miss Daulne, an immensely popular performer: "Director of French Programming Marcel Belliveau recommended Daulne, for both French and English audiences, after seeing the FrancoFête performance in Moncton."

A group of concerned people on campus realize this, and have joined forces with the Chaplaincy Center and the Student Union to organize a food drive project, dubbed "Stock the UPEI Community Kitchen."

In keeping with a Valentine's Day theme, the "Heart to Heart" effort will place boxes in buildings on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday until noon. Non-perishable items are being sought, including foodstuffs, baby food, toiletries, diapers, and treats for children. Financial donations are also welcomed, and may be given to Sr. Joan in the Chaplaincy Center.

"There is a need," organizers said. "[We're] not sure how great, but want to be able to offer some help to those who are needy."

Distribution information will be available as the project gets underway. In the meanwhile, the items collected will be held at the Chaplaincy Center.
