Canada Has 2 Feature Spots In Royal Tournament Pageant

LONDON (CP) — Canada has two feature spots in this year's Royal Tournament, the annual pageant at London's Paris Court which highlights military tattoos and other displays. The 55-man band of the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry heads a list of seven bands that will play before more than 250,000 people expected to take in the 18-day tournament. When the Pats march into the covered arena opening night to night they will make history as the first Canadian Army unit to take part in Britain's famous military show, now in its 69th year. STATIONED IN GERMANY The PPCLI band is stationed in Germany with the 4th Canadian Infantry Brigade Group.

Seizure Tactics Are Abhorred

OTTAWA (CP) — Prompt attention to the reported seizure of household goods of unemployed Cape Breton miners by finance companies was promised Tuesday by Finance Minister Fleming. In the Commons, Cof House Leader Hazen Argue said he had received a telegram from William Marsh, president of district 26 of the United Mine Workers of America (Ind.), charging companies are repossessing household essentials. Mr. Argue suggested the federal superintendent of insurance should investigate "this deplorable situation." Mr. Fleming said that if the government is given adequate information, such as the names of the finance companies, "we will certainly give it prompt attention." Mr. Argue promised to get the information.

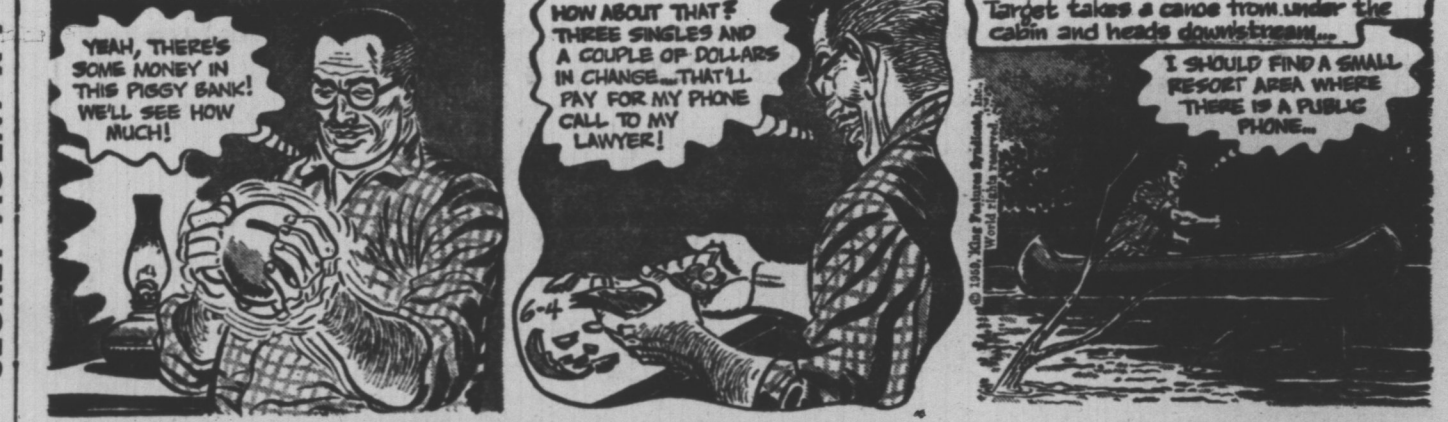
