Scholarships valued to a maximum of \$4500.00 per year awarded to students entering first year law at U.N.B. Scholarships are renewable for second and third years of study. Applications are available at Student Services.

DEADLINE: March 31, 1986

- (2) **Tore Martin Grade Scholarships in Law**
Scholarships to value of tuition, awarded to a student or students from Atlantic provinces accepted in law at U.N.B. Applicant will be considered on basis of academic

ability, extra-curricular activities and need. Applications available from Student Services.

DEADLINE: July 31, 1986

- (3) **Law Foundation of British Columbia Scholarship Program**

Scholarships in amount of \$4500.00 available to students entering first year law program at University of Victoria. Applicant must be a Canadian citizen or permanent residence status and have an outstanding pre-law academic record. Applications are available at Student Services.

DEADLINE: April 15, 1986.

- (4) **Justice Mark R. MacGinn Memorial Scholarship**

Awarded through the Registrar's office at U.P.E.I. in August of each year. Award is made to a student pursuing studies in Law although other graduate programs may be considered. Students interested in studying law should make their intention known to the Registrar's office.

- (5) **Legal Studies For Aboriginal People**

Ten scholarships available to Metis and non-status Indian students who wish to attend law school in 1986-87. Scholarships are renewable for three years and

cover the costs of tuition, monthly living allowance, textbooks and travel allowance and necessary moving expense in some cases. Applications are available at Student Services.
