NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market finished in the minus column Tuesday for the third straight session.

Some key issues dropped fractions to about 2 points. Numerous leaders were up fractions and a handful of specialties rose 1 to 3 points.

Volume was a moderate 2,070,000 shares compared with 2,130,000 shares Monday.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 30 cents to \$162.20. Industrials, down 90 cents at mid-day, closed off 20 cents. Rails declined 50 cents and utilities 10 cents.

Of 1,144 stocks traded, 592 were lower, 294 higher and 258 unchanged.
