More About That \$100,000.

It appears to be generally believed that Mrs. Phillips intended, and really had willed her property to him. Mr. Hunter fancied, on account of her great age, that the property was almost already his, and that any day might result in making him a rich man by her death. There is nothing in such an assumption to palliate the offence. It was one of a most grave character, and should prove a warning to others who hold the funds of widows and orphans in trust. It is tolerably certain that the will has been cancelled, and the indications are that the notary will be required to pay up every cent of the indebtedness to the estate. Altogether few events have occurred in Montreal in circles of business or social life that have produced so startling an effect during the past few years. It is likely there will now be a general ransacking of all documents, and a looking up of their affairs by those who have been in the habit of leaving them to be administered by curators and agents. This may do much good, but if it does it will be the only bright spot in a picture of more than ordinary sombre tints. At present Mr. Hunter is at his country seat in Napraine, almost beside himself over the position of his affairs. His family it need not be said feel their position very keenly. It is to them and upon their account chiefly that much sympathy is expressed.

Assassins in Ireland.

A telegram from Parsonstown, King's County, states that Sub-Constable Edward Brown had been assassinated there. Last Saturday, accompanied by another constable, he passed the public house of Kieranan Egan, on Townsend street, when a man standing in the doorway fired four shots at him from a revolver. One shot struck Brown in the back, and passed through his right lung. The murderer escaped through the house into the yard, which opens into a side street. From this point all traces of him were lost. The street was crowded, it being market day. A doctor was in immediate attendance. Brown lingered in great agony till midnight, when he died. Two arrests were made to-day. A revolver was found in the yard of the public house. Brown had only been two months in Parsonstown.

A Civic Expense.

The city of New York, with a population of a little over a million and a quarter, has an army of 10,000 office-holders who draw from the municipal treasury \$10,000,000 a year; an army, in the words of the Shipping and Commercial List, "larger than Gen. Scott had when he marched from Vera Cruz to the Halls of Montezuma," and yet the total amount of taxes paid by New York, about \$20,000,000 is not large relatively to the cost of governing Paris, for instance; but it is probably true that a much larger proportion of the taxes is probably true that a much larger proportion of the taxes is wasted in the former than in the latter city. But the per capita tax in New York is not one-third what it is in Paris. The difference is that Paris gets more for its money and is far more economically governed, though on a vastly increased scale of expenditure.

England's Future Movements in Egypt.

The Times says: "When Arabi's army has been dispersed and its leaders brought to account for their misdeeds, we shall have to make sure that the difficulty may not recur in any form. Egypt will be in our hands; it will not be open to us to retire from the country and leave events to take their own course. This is the resolve of England, and when it becomes necessary to seek the sanction of the other powers for the result, the concert of Europe will be invoked in a sense very different from that with which we have lately been familiar."

Briefs of Latest News.

White frost is reported on the upper St. John. Arabi is said to be two miles from Ismailia. There were 170 suspects in prison in Ireland on the 2nd inst. The lash has been put in operation on wife-beaters in Maryland. General Ignatieff is reported to have been arrested and sent to St. Petersburg under escort. French Bankers telegrams from Egypt confirm the report that Arabi will submit to the Sultan. A car factory on a large scale is being talked of for Ottawa, and a company is now being organized. Two Socialist members of the German Reichstag have been sent to prison for abuse of the Federal Council. Recent rains have ruined Germany's crops, which promised to yield the most abundant harvest of many years. At North Sandwich, Mass., forest fires burnt 2,000 acres of woodland, an many houses. Hundreds of people are flying from the fire. A portion of the passengers of the wrecked Mosel have been forwarded to New York. Some of them were heartlessly robbed at the Lizard by the residents on the shore.

Personal.

PROFESSOR BLACKIE has resigned the chair of Greek in Edinburgh University. THE Duke of Connaught and Prince Lou's of Bottenburg have inspected Arabi's positions. HENRY GEORGE, who was arrested on Thursday on suspicion of associating with suspects has been liberated. THE Duchess of Cambridge lately gave a small dinner party to celebrate her eighty-fifth birthday. LORD EUSTACE CECIL said publicly the other night, in England: "Without the slightest wish to disparage the Life Guards, I cannot understand why men six feet two inches high should be sent out to ride Egyptian donkeys." MUTUAL courtesies have been exchanged between the Duke of Connaught and the King. The latter sent his children to call on the Prince. The Khedive is reported to have received Sir Edwin Malet most cordially on his return, and to have renewed towards him all the confidence he showed him before his departure for England.
