

R.C.A.F. Overcome Five Run Deficit To Earn Draw Game With Abbies

The R. C. A. F. Royals fought back from a five-run deficit at the Port Diamond, Summerside, yesterday and managed to draw with the Abbies in the sixth inning against the Charlottetown Abbies. The remaining three frames were scoreless and the game ended as a 6-6 stalemate.

Bob Barlow went the route for the Armies and the big left hander allowed nine hits, striking out only four and issuing a single free ticket. Charlie Ryan pitched superbly for five innings, allowing only three hits up to that time, but the Royals ganged up on him in the sixth, belting him out with five safe bingles. Donnie MacLean came in to relieve with the score 6 to 5, and although the tying run did get batted across against this pitching, he did a capable fireman's job nevertheless, striking out five batters. Barlow had driven in the tying counter. Just one other hit was collected off his slants in the next three innings.

Four Horses Lower Records In Stellar Racing At Covehead

With Tiny Budlong, owned by Linus Mulligan of Kinkora, and driven by Teddy Weir, pacing the fastest mile over an island track this year to lower his previous record of 2:12 2-5 by a full two seconds, three other horses lowered their marks to give a huge crowd of ardent racing fans a stellar afternoon of racing entertainment over the Covehead Raceway yesterday afternoon. Tiny set his mark of 2:10 2-5 in winning the second heat of the second race.

Performing over an ideal track under perfect weather conditions, Calumet Onward, owned and driven by Harold Stead of Brackley, lowered his own mark twice during the meet, while Direct Volo and Guy Harvester set new records of 2:16 3-5 and 2:13 respectively. Direct Volo was driven by Teddy Weir and is owned by Power Brothers of Charlottetown, while Guy Harvester is owned and driven by Fred Reeves of Summerside.

Harold Stead's Calumet Onward lowered his mark of 2:18 3-5 to 2:16 in winning the first heat of the fourth race and came on even better in the second heat to establish a new record which now stands at 2:15 3-5.

Making his first appearance over an island track, Argot Pointer, Horace B. Willis' newly purchased pacing stallion, also turned in an impressive performance when he set up the second best time of the season, 2:11, and copping off race honors in the number two event with a 1-1-4 summary. Mr. Willis, who purchased Argot Pointer from Alderman J. Harry Breen of Halifax, last week, handled the ribbons himself.

One of the most exciting races of the meet was the second event on the card, which was forced to a fourth and deciding heat when Billy McVey clipped off honors in the first heat, Tiny Budlong in the second and Rhodola D. in the third. All four heats were terrific, closely battled affairs, with Rhodola finally winning the deciding heat for race honors with Billy and Tiny placing second and third respectively.

For speed, performance and excitement, it was a superb afternoon of racing that gave the large crowd a thrill a minute.
