

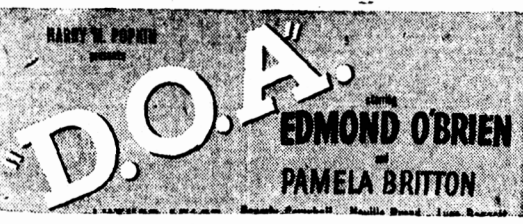

Special Fire Drill Held At Montague School
Yesterday afternoon a special fire drill was held in the Montague High School, under the direction of Mr. T. A. Campbell, Provincial fire marshal. Under the present conditions for civil defence, Mr. Campbell explained to the students, every precaution is being taken to reduce accidents arising from insufficient preparation in knowing what should be done when a fire occurs. It was his hope, he said, to visit the schools to establish fire drill so that the school might be vacated as quickly as possible.

He then explained in detail the procedure to be followed to each class, and on the ringing of the bell each room filed out in close order to the open ground. The school was vacated in less than one minute with the students moving in orderly fashion. Each teacher took along the register to check off the students so as to determine if all were present. It is expected that another drill will be held shortly so as to accustom the children to vacate a building quickly and orderly.
