Norman Bates Is Cause or Suit

MONTREAL (CP)—A \$300,000 damage action has been filed in superior court by the parents of a 16-month-old baby, Andrew G. Olney and his wife Aileen of Sherbrooke, Que., are seeking reparation from Richardson-Merrell Incorporated, a pharmaceutical firm with head offices in Toronto. No data was set for a hearing. The couple claims their daughter Marie Theresa was born with deformed ears last March 20 because of thalidomide medicine administered to Mrs. Olney by her physician in Sherbrooke. Their petition says the pharmaceutical firm "knew, or should most conclusively be presumed to have known, that thalidomide was a highly dangerous drug."

First Chinese Canadian Lady Runs For Commons In West

By DENNIS ORCHARD VANCOUVER (CP)—Glady's (Dynamo) Chong needed only a slight push for her plunge into politics. And now that she's in she's likely to stay. "I don't win this time I'll try again," she says. The first Chinese-Canadian woman to try for a seat in the House of Commons, she's running in Vancouver East, a riding that has been represented provincially and then federally by the New Democratic Party's Harold Winch without a break since 1953. She's running as a Progressive Conservative.

As a result of this play—the refusal to trump the king of spades—declarer went down one.

DECLARER led a heart towards dummy and finessed the nine, losing to the queen. East then cashed the jack of spades and West later scored the ace of trump to defeat the contract one trick.

It would not have helped Spade to trump the king of hearts from dummy instead of the nine, because East would sooner or later have gotten in with the queen of hearts to score the jack of spades as the setting trick. There was no way for South to make the hand once West discarded on the king of spades.

The outcome would have been different if Bowie had trumped the spade at trick two. In that case, declarer could make the hand against any line of defense. He would win any return and play a heart to the king, but restricted himself to the loss of a spade, a spade ruff, and a trump trick.

Bowie reacted correctly that the hand could not be defeated unless his partner had the queen which South played. With the ace of diamonds on the bidding, and Bowie therefore knew his hand would be unable to cash another spade trick unless East had an entry in the form of the queen of hearts. Declarer would obviously be able to discard his remaining spades on dummy's long diamonds.

The only way of creating an entry card to East's hand was to refuse to ruff the king of spades.

She wrote the music, taught the girls and made their costumes. The Grandview area of east-central Vancouver, where Mrs. Chong has run a full-time business as a fashion designer for 23 years, sends someone four years ago to appear at the trade fair to choose its beauty queen and host her for the Miss Vancouver title. Obviously a job for Gladys-Chong, and she has held it ever since. Mrs. Chong, who has two sons, Terry, 20, an arts student at the University of British Columbia

and a daughter, Cathy, 17, a student at the University of British Columbia, Ripley's Believe It or Not? Mrs. Chong, 45, swings considerable weight in the Chinese community of east-central Vancouver, active in the Parents Teachers Association and the local community centre, and has been associated with an assortment of special groups that she has created as she felt necessary. Her father, Rev. Y. M. Kwan, of Brampton, Ontario, was the first Chinese-born pastor of the Baptist Church in Canada. He lived to the age of 104 years, 9 months.

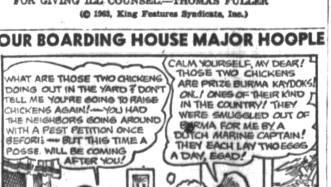
