S'side Council Informed Tax Collections Improved

SUMMERSIDE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN
Coun. Lee Wood, chairman of the finance committee revealed at last night's meeting of the Summerside Town Council that 93 percent of town taxes have been paid to date which is an improvement over many years. He said that judgments have been entered against those who haven't paid their taxes as yet.

He said the town assessor, G. M. Muttart, and his assistant, W. A. Gaudet, are now working on the assessment roll and hope to have this completed by the week of Jan. 20th. He added that the services of John Schurman in assisting the assessors may be required starting next week.

Councillor Wood said the tax roll should have been completed by Dec. 31st but Mr. Muttart had been working alone and hadn't asked for assistance, so "the delay is unavoidable".

A motion was passed that the assessment roll for 1960 be extended from Dec. 31 to Jan. 20th.

Councillor Ernest Morrison, reporting for the Stadium, said that during the first three weeks of operation, Civic Stadium was used at the rate of approximately 50 hours per week. This time was taken up with 17 skating sessions, with 5,562 skaters using the facilities. Also 2,168 patrons saw three hockey games, giving an average of 728 per game and 326 per skating session.

SHOWS PROFIT
The average cost per hour during this period for producing ice was \$12.07 (this does not include maintenance cost). The Stadium absorbed \$942.23 on minor and school hockey time, but after absorbing this cost the Stadium was able to show a net profit of \$673.51 and the canteen a net profit of \$428.63 or a total of \$1,102.14.

Coun. W. E. MacCausland, chairman of the electric light committee stated that the plant had produced 445,500 kilowatts in November and had purchased 653,750 kilowatts from Maritime Electric or 59 percent of the total output.

He also read the reports of superintendent George Morrison and line foreman Edward Gallant.

Mr. Gallant stated the department was having trouble with broken street lights on North Market Street, apparently by vandals. He said the street lighting at Hillcrest was going on and will be completed as equipment arrives.

Coun. MacCausland stated the groundwork for procuring the new diesel engine for the plant has been completed and the unit is expected to arrive March 31st. He stated the peak load had been 2900 kilowatts which happened at 5.15 one evening. He added that less electricity is used on a good clear night but on a cloudy night may go 200 or more kilowatts higher.

EQUIPMENT READY
Coun. Robert Dewar, chairman of the street committee, said the snow equipment is ready for action for whatever may turn up. He stated he was happy to report that the streets at Hillcrest are now in good condition.

He said that steps had been taken to sand slippery streets but added that there is no one on call to take charge of this on snow days.

During the month 12 new services have been installed which about completes the applications on file. A new hydrant has been installed on Ottawa Street replacing one that has been causing trouble.

Fans Pick Up 6,000 Tickets

Truck Driver 'Corrects' Story Of Road Accident

Everett Gray, of Brackley, operator of a truck that was near the scene of last Friday's Brackley Point Road crash, which was followed yesterday by the death of Harold P. Cudmore, on Monday supplied The Guardian with some details of the accident. In some particulars they differ from the original report published on Saturday.

The accident occurred almost at the gate of his property, Mr. Gray said. He had been using his truck to tow a car and was heading toward Charlottetown, he added, but came to a stop when a neighbor Herbert Phillips, in another truck, halted on the other side of the road, and hailed him to ask if Mr. Gray was in any trouble, and if he could be of any assistance.

Mr. Phillips, also of Brackley, was headed north when the meeting took place.

When the two trucks stopped, their dimmers lights were on and a caution blinker was in operation, Mr. Gray said. The car driven by Mr. Cudmore, also a neighbor of Mr. Gray and Mr. Phillips, was coming from Charlottetown when it rammed into the rear of the Phillips' truck, he declared.

Mr. Gray particularly stressed that neither he nor Mr. Phillips had stopped to "exchange pleasantries." Rather, he explained, the stop was made because of the effort of one man to be of assistance to another and he feels proper safety precautions were taken.

P.E.I. RED CROSS REMEMBERS REFUGEES

Putting the finishing touches on the addressing of five cases of clothing to the League of Red Cross Societies in Belgium is Miss Beulah Munroe, director of Red Cross women's work for P.E.I. These cases are destined for the relief of the thousands

of Hungarian refugees still in camps in Austria. These cases contained 1,200 articles of clothing made up by P.E.I. women's groups. Included in this shipment were 600 garments for babies and 600 other pieces of clothing for children up to eight

years of age. This work is carried on, year in and year out, as a very important part of Red Cross activities in every province in Canada. However, this work is being "stepped up" during 1959-60 which is being observed as "World Refugee Year".

Mayor Says Co-operation Is Necessary To Run Town

Mayor W. A. Currie told the Summerside Town Council at the regular monthly meeting last night that the "Town manager system has got to be put back on the tracks at once, and there must not be any ordering of anything except through the manager and comptroller. It's the only way we can control our purchases."

All councillors were present at the meeting as well as the Town Manager J. A. Brophy and Town Clerk J. E. Cameron.

Mayor Currie stated, "Certain incidents have happened recently, and in particular the gravel purchase which leads me to believe the incidents may have been caused through a misunderstanding in some quarters of the functions and authority of a councillor, and I will briefly review them."

"Our Act states that the administration of the town affairs shall be vested in a principal officer, the mayor, and such councillors who shall constitute the town council. Wherever authority is mentioned throughout the Act, it is the 'mayor and council' shall—no authority is given whatever to an individual councillor.

"The council sets up committees under the authority of the council to administer certain phases or departments of the town business and carry out its laid down policies. These committees are not to be concerned or interfere with the whole, and when council is in session they are privileged, and should, inquire into any matter or offer constructive criticism in the best interest of civic government," he stated.

"The mayor as principal officer, must on occasion exercise some authority and make minor decisions. For instance, it would not be desirable or even possible to call a council meeting to decide a point arising out of the carrying out of council policy. This authority is implied or handed down through precedent rather than specifically stated in the act. He certainly hasn't authority to act on his own initiative if outside council policy. These are all safeguards which those who framed our Act of Incorporation wisely provided for the protection of citizens," the mayor said.

"Four years ago due to the fact that our finances had become over extended because of acquiring the Stadium, the building of a new high school, a new auditorium, because of the cost of repairing the sleet storm damage and extension of streets and water and sewerage services due to the constant growth of our town, we found we are suddenly faced with \$1,000,000 of new debt and new methods of control were necessary.

"We accordingly decided to adopt the town manager system which has been implemented by so many towns and cities these last years as trained men become available.

"We hired our town manager by unanimous vote of the council and outlined his duties as executive officer of the council and its committees with special emphasis on control of our purchases and general financing. During the life of the council of that day there was complete co-operation of all committees.

"During the last two years the majority of the committees have continued to co-operate to the complete satisfaction of the council, myself and the citizens but there have been breaches and lack of co-operation with other committees and it has never turned out for the good of council or our citizens.

"I want to impress upon all here that much more will be accomplished through complete co-operation and co-ordination of responsibilities than through division and interference with committees appointed for a specific purpose. You will find that besides much more being accomplished, we will take more pride in our work on the council and the citizens will have much more confidence and respect."
