MISDIRECTED ENTERPRISE.

Train Robber Wilson's Actual Record Was His Fate Was Only 635.

S. A. Wilson, the enterprising young Missourian who distinguished himself on May 28 by holding a Missouri Pacific express train, alone and single handed, on which the governor of the state was a passenger, himself up to the authorities and dictating to the St. Louis reporters a bold but veracious narrative of his exploit. According to this story, the most remarkable part of the affair was the pusillanimity of the train hands, who conformed very readily to the requests of the highwayman.

Wilson is a telegraphman and was employed in Lantz telegraph at St. Louis, and by his own account the idea of robbing an express car came as a sudden inspiration, but the reports of his previous connection with sundry swindling operations indicate a moral nature that was essentially crooked. When the happy thought of becoming a highwayman struck Wilson, he immediately abandoned his telegraph key, equipped himself with two sticks of dynamite, a pair of pistols and a shocking bad hat and took the train for St. Louis, where he walked to Pacific and there boarded the night express.

Crawling over the tender into the cab, he commanded the engine and fireman, at the point of the revolver, to stop the train. These gentlemen promptly complied and stepped to the ground. As Wilson's request they complied with a commendable combination of baggage and express car. The messenger refusing admission, the robber placed a dynamite cartridge under the door, attached a light fuse to it and retreated to a safe distance with Engineer Hamilton and Fireman Finch.

There are a number of stories told about Charles Coghlan's adventures in New York and in London, says the Sun. One of the most widely circulated anecdotes is that of the actor and an actress of high reputation in London. Mr. Coghlan and the actress had been much talked about on account of what was generally termed their "goings on." One night they kept going on until they had tired out nearly all the hansom drivers in London, and finally they dropped into the Continental Hotel restaurant, which is a showy and convivial sort of place, for breakfast. They had finished breakfast, and had just stepped out in the glaring light of a May morning, and stood side by side, when a cab was driven furiously up and stopped in front of them, and Mrs. Coghlan, the actor's wife, jumped out and faced the enquirer. Without turning a hair, Mr. Coghlan looked at his wife indignantly for a moment, then raised his hat and bowed to each of his companions in turn, and said suavely: "As you ladies doubtless have something of a personal nature to say to one another, I will not disturb you." They then stepped quietly into the cab and drove away, while the woman stood with a baffled look, gazing after him.
