Stolen Stamps And Money Orders Found

MONTMAGNY, Que. (CP)—Stamps and money orders, believed stolen from the post office at L'Islet, Que., last week, were found Monday night on the bank of the St. Lawrence river near this community 35 miles east of Quebec.

Police said they believe the thieves threw the loot into the water and it floated to shore. They did not reveal the value of the stamps.

The burglary at the post office 15 miles east of here netted the thieves \$750 in postage stamps, \$200 in unemployment-insurance stamps and \$50 in cash.
