Newsprint Price Change Reconsidered

NEW YORK (AP)—Some segments of the newsprint industry have backed down from a \$10-a-ton price increase. They substituted a \$5 boost.

Bozwater Paper Co. and Donlar Newsprint, which previously announced \$10 raises, said they would instead put \$5 increases into effect May 16.

Abitibi Power and Paper Co. said it was considering its prices. Crown Zellerbach Corp. initiated the \$10 boost March 4 and was followed by nine other Canadian producers.

The industry ranks were broken Monday when International Paper Sales Co. announced a \$7 increase and Great Northern Paper Co. and Kimberly-Clark Corp. announced \$5 boosts.

As a result, several prices are being quoted for newsprint—\$144 a ton, \$141 and \$139. Some southern newspapers are being quoted a price of \$145 a ton.

The American Newspaper Publishers Association, the Southern Newspaper Publishers Association and individual newspapers have protested the \$10 increase as unwarranted and unjustified and asked the producers to reconsider.

A newsprint industry trade publication, Pulp and Paper, said newsprint is moving into short supply and will be as scarce this spring as it was last November.

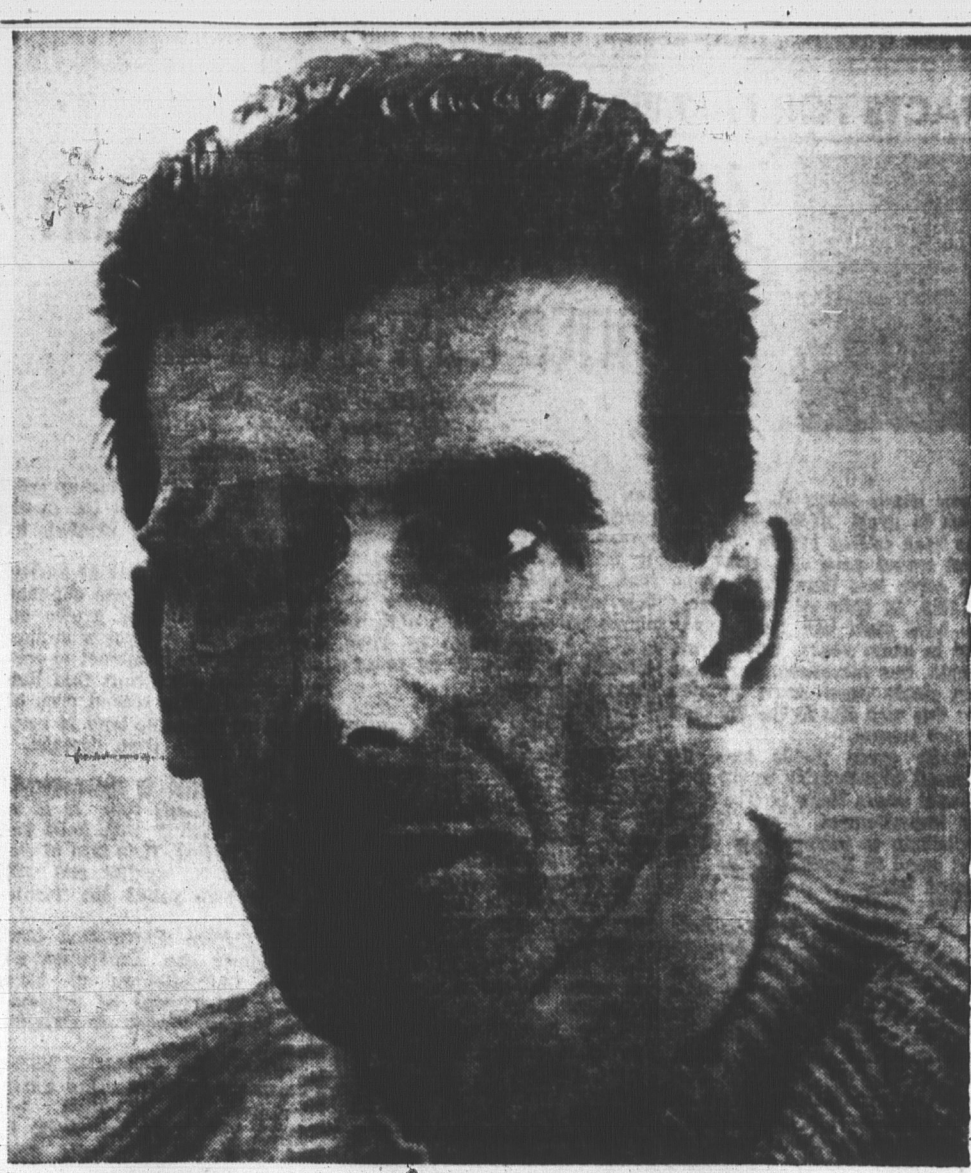
