Quick, Watson! What has 18 legs and lives in the cellar. You're right; the Los Angeles Dodgers. Such humorous references to anyone but a Dodger fan, that is—have been rather common this year. Comedians and pundits on the West Coast have been having something of a field day at the Bums' expense, and hardly a day passes when a new joke isn't devised, or an old one isn't resurrected, dusted off and revised to fit the situation.

If the critics aren't thinking up barbs for the L.A. team, owner Walter O'Malley makes a good target, as does the team's home prancing grounds, the Coliseum. O'Malley and the stadium probably deserve all the condemnation they get, but the team is a different story.

While the Dodgers have been in the basement of the National League for some time, it must be remembered that this is one cellar that isn't too far from the roof. At the time of writing L.A. was only 9½ games off the pace, which isn't an insurmountable deficit by any means.

In fact, a few wins put together could change the loop's standing in a hurry. None of the teams can be counted on, and although it should be in the long run, it is difficult at this stage to tell just what clubs have the class.

All have made serious bids for the lead at one time or another and it would seem that it won't be until late, late in the year before even the tail-enders will be decided.

All of which is a healthy situation for the box office. The Dodgers and Giants—as expected—are running far ahead of their attendances last year in New York and even Milwaukee is running in front. Something of a surprise in view of its near sell out attendance in other years.

A "mental error" found its way into the box score of a game between the Braves and Cardinals last week. Mechanical bobbles normally are the only ones you will find in a box score and a mental error is something of a rarity. Shortstop Reuben Amaro of the Cards didn't even touch the ball, in fact was nowhere near the scene of the crime, yet got charged with the error, after the official scorer reversed his decision.

It all came about this way: Two were out in the sixth. Del Crandall of the Braves was on first, Bill Bruton was at bat. On a pitch Crandall took off in an attempt to steal second and made it going away. Even a good throw would not have gotten him. But it so happened that catcher Hobie Landrith's throw was not only good, but just about perfect. It hit the bag an instant after Crandall slid in. Landrith had done his part without a flaw.

But the catch was that Amaro was nowhere to be found. He was spotted a little later wandering around with Don Blasingame in short centre field. The ball rolled on into left field and Crandall ended up on third. It was ruled a stolen base and an error on Landrith.

But reporters in the press box put up a howl and the scorer shortly reversed his decision and gave Amaro the miscue for not covering the bag.

The scoring rule on a mental lapse is quite clear but not often invoked. It reads like this: An error shall be charged against any fielder when failure to stop or try to stop an accurately thrown ball permits a runner to advance, providing there was occasion for the throw. If such a throw be made to second base, the scorer shall determine whether it was the duty of the second baseman or the shortstop to stop the ball and an error shall be charged to the negligent player.

Why was the bobbie charged to Amaro and not second baseman Blasingame? Because the bater was a lefthanded hitter, Bruton, and the scorekeeper figured the shortstop is supposed to cover second in such a case.

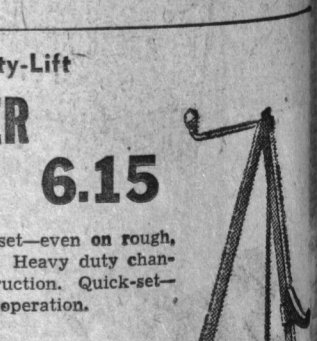
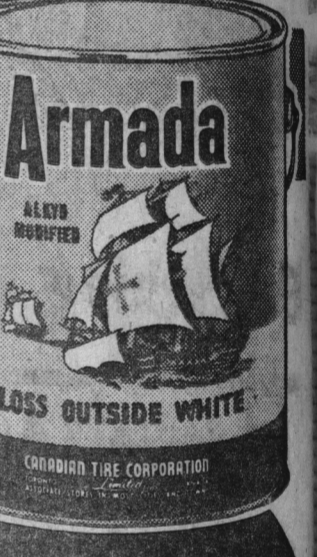
