MANCHESTER, England (AP)—Hugh Gaitskell Sunday dissociated his Labor party from the government stand on Cyprus.



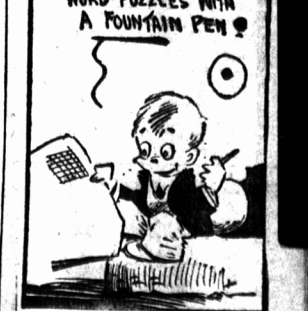

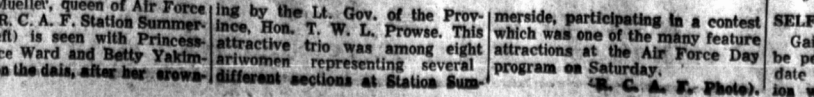


AM OPTIMIST IS A GUY WHO DOES CROSS-WORD PUZZLES WITH A FOUNTAIN PEN
