GEORGE HAS A DEGREE IN MARINE BIOLOGY AND A JOB DRIVING

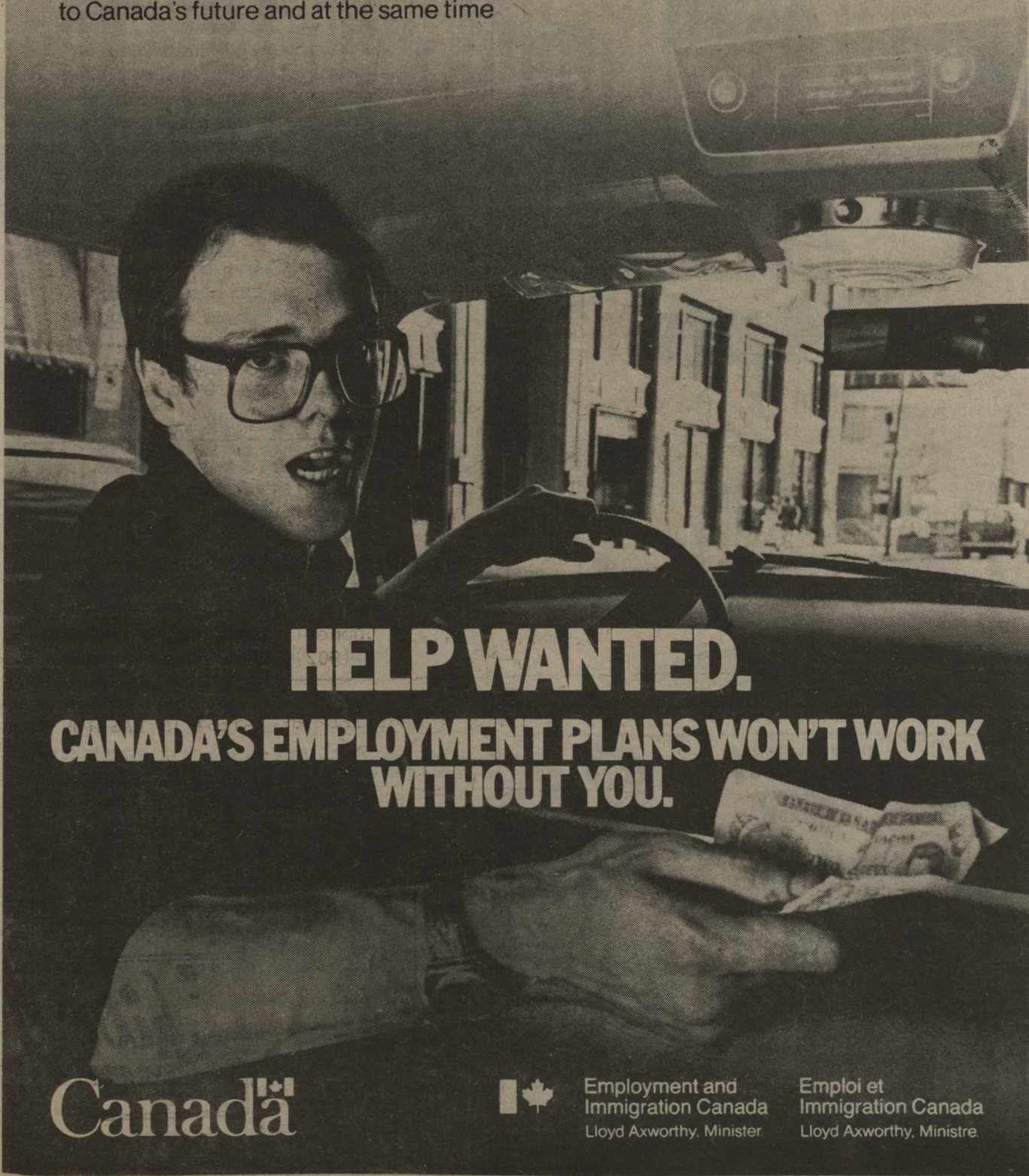
