### Car Struck By Train At Abney Crossing Yesterday

At approximately 11:30 yesterday morning, William Harry Richards, 41, Abney, was involved in a collision between a car and train at the Abney crossing, four miles from Murray Harbour South. The car, driven by Mr. Richards, partially stalled on approaching the level crossing. He was attempting to "rev" the car up to get

across, when the collision occurred. The train struck the front end of the car causing extensive damage to the vehicle. Mr. Richards was the lone occupant. He was taken to King's County Hospital, Montague, by Jack Ferguson. Dr. Lester Brohaut was called on the case. Full extent of injuries had not been determined at a late hour.

### Souris Youths Among Voyagers To Antarctic

London, Eng.—When the M.V. Theron slipped down the River Thames last week on the first leg of a 14,000-mile voyage from London to the shores of the Antarctic Continent, her 17-man crew included a pair of adventure-seeking youths from Souris, P.E.I. They are Jim MacDonald, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Reg MacDonald, and Kimball Jarvis, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Jarvis. The Theron (shown above), a sturdy, 849-ton Arctic sealer, has been enlisted to carry the advance party for the carefully-planned Trans-Antarctic Expedition, a bid to penetrate the vast, unexplored regions of Antarctica.

In addition to her crew of 17, the Theron has made room for 17 members of the expedition, including the leader, Dr. Vivian Fuchs, and 300 tons of supplies and equipment, including a prefabricated house, three tractors, two aircraft, 24 Greenland-bred husky dogs, and other miscellaneous supplies.

A world-famous explorer will join the party aboard the Theron, when the ship reaches Montevideo, in the person of Sir Edmund Hillary of New Zealand, who conquered Mount Everest on May 29, 1953, along with Tensing Norkay of India. Hillary will return to New Zealand next spring after the advance party establishes its base at Shackleton.

The Theron, which is under command of Captain Harald Maro of Chester, N.S., will remain in the Antarctic until the base has been established, returning to London in March, 1956. The Expedition proper, to Antarctica, which contains an area of 6,000,000 square miles—al-

### Crippled U. S. Plane Reaches Safety

HALIFAX (CP)—RCAF search and rescue here said Monday that a United States Air Force B-29 had limped safely into Gander, Nfld., airport after developing engine trouble over the Atlantic. Details of the plane's trouble were not available here, but an earlier report from Gander said the four-engine bomber was limping toward the airport at 90 miles an hour with two engines feathered.

Air-sea rescue planes from American bases at Harmon field and Argentina escorted the plane to Gander from a point 130 miles east of the base. Eleven crew members were aboard.
