QUIZ Your right-hand opponent deals and opens the bidding with Three Hearts, neither side vulnerable. What would you now bid with each of the following five hands?

- 1. ♠A85 ♥J ♣AK9 ♦KQJ986
2. ♠A9 ♥KQ85 ♦AK983 ♣KJ7
3. ♠6 ♥J74 ♦AQ8683 ♣A75
4. ♠AKJ9832 ♥7 ♦K6 ♣A78
5. ♠AK865 ♥— ♦KQ94 ♣AQJ2

1. Double. This hand is too good to merely bid four clubs... 2. Pass. There can be little advantage to competing at this point... 3. Three no trump. This bid means just what it says... 4. Four spades. Decisive action must be taken... 5. Four hearts. This is an ideal hand with which to cuebid the opponent's suit.

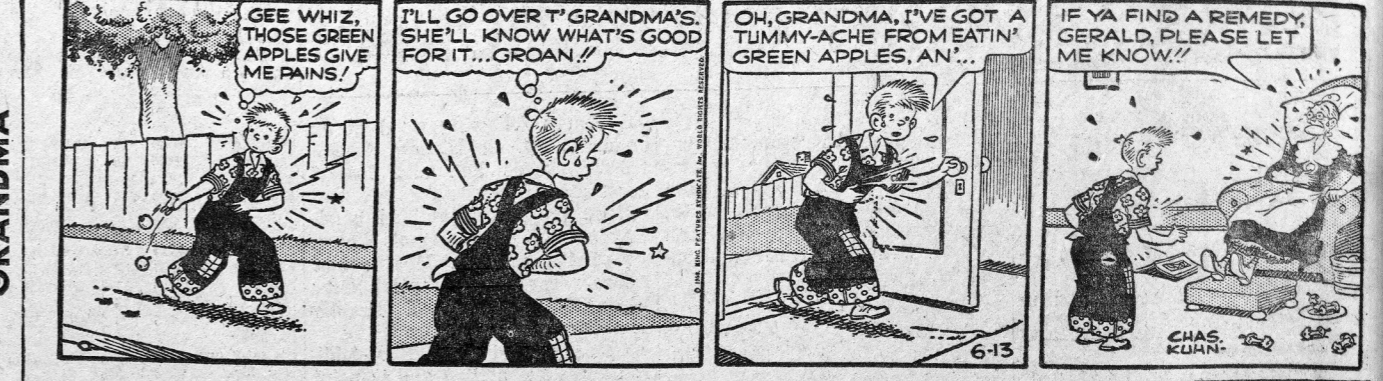

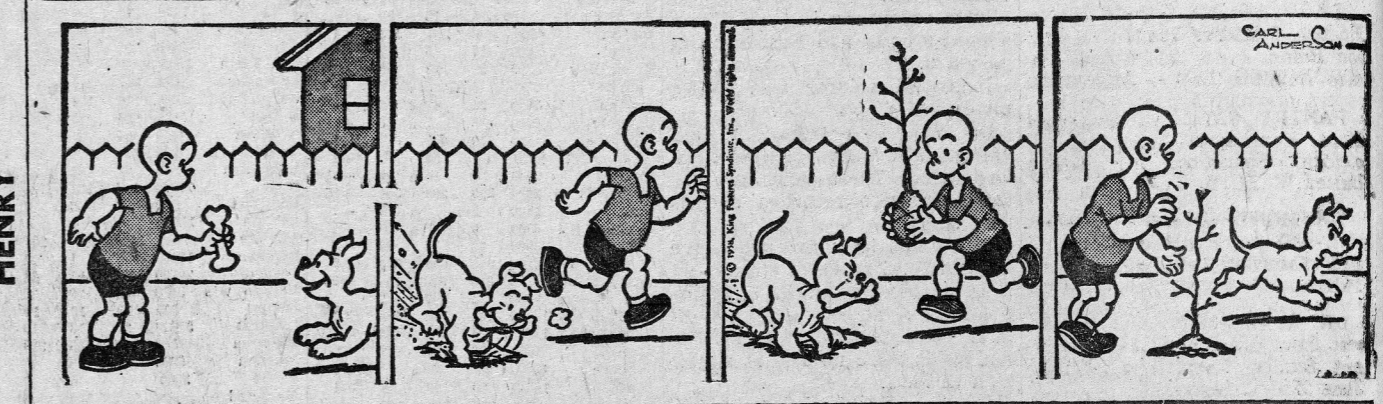
