MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar today closed at a discount of 3 29-32 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 1-16. Pound sterling \$2.68 13-16, up 3-16.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market was lifted slightly in the closing minutes Thursday but the rally wasn't nearly strong enough

to prevent a moderate decline. Gold lost less than one-half point and western oils were practically unchanged.

Gains moved in a wider range than losses but the declines held the majority.

Uraniums climbed consistently as Algonquin led with a 2 1/2-point gain. In early activity it added three points at a new high of 21 1/4. Pronto climbed 60 cents in heavy turnover. Other uranium's marked up 10-20 cent gains.

Senior base metals were mixed in a fractional range while most juniors had gains of five to 15 cents. Iron Ray, however, was ahead 50 cents and Kilemb 27 cents. Western oils were quiet with few large price changes.
