Rev. Father McLean Remembered at St. George's

Before leaving St. George's Parish for the mission of Summerside, Rev. J. C. McLean was presented with addresses by the congregation and the promoters of the League of the Sacred Heart, accompanied with presents whose united contents amounted to upwards of \$100.

ADDRESSES.

Rev. J. C. McLean: Rev. and Dear Father, - Today the whole parish of St. George's contracted in one fervent prayer. We, your humble parishioners having our hearts in grief for the loss we sustained through the death of our old pastor, the venerable Father Francis, whose memory shall always be green, had our measure of grief filled to overflowing when we learned that you were about to sever your connection with this parish.

The ties which bind us to you are so manifold, so intricate and so sacred that we view the surrendering of them with a broader and deeper sense of sorrow and regret than that which usually attends the separation of a well-beloved pastor from his devoted flock.

That you may the more fully appreciate our attachment to you and the feelings occasioned by seeing you depart from our midst, we need only mention that this parish is your native soil and that your boyhood's days are associated with pleasant memories, that the first year of your sacerdotal labors was spent for our spiritual advancement, and that for over eight years you have been our zealous and devoted pastor.

But this does not sum up all that you have done for us. You have beautified our place of Divine worship and procured church furnishings which now make our church one of the best equipped in the diocese. And to cement us in bonds of love and unity to God you have established the association of the League of the Sacred Heart, to which we are happy to say we all belong.

What you have done to promote the spiritual and temporal welfare of your flock will undoubtedly keep your name in benediction among us for ages to come. Indeed, if there was nothing else to awaken our gratitude and excite our admiration but the edification we received by your loving care in his declining age of our faithful friend and spiritual counselor for many years - the venerable Father Francis - it would be sufficient to insure to you an undying memory.

Whilst we now bid you an affectionate but sorrowful farewell we ask you to remember us in your supplications to the Throne of Grace, and be assured that we on our part shall not fail to offer up our humble prayers to the Giver of all good things that He may give you strength to discharge the duties of your sacred calling faithfully and well, and that you may receive in an abundant measure the happiness which falls to the lot of the good priest here on earth.
