DEVELOPMENT OF THE CANADIAN DAIRY INDUSTRY.

A recently printed official document gives the evidence of J. A. Ruddle, Dairy and Cold Storage Commissioner, taken before a committee of Parliament. It is somewhat surprising to learn from this source that Quebec is far in the lead in the production of all the other Provinces in the number of cheese factories, creameries and skimming stations taken together having a total of 2,806 against 1,284 in Ontario, 68 in New Brunswick, 57 in Manitoba, 53 in Alberta, 47 in Prince Edward Island, 17 in Nova Scotia, 16 in British Columbia and 7 in Saskatchewan.

Some interesting facts about condensed milk are given. Two kinds of this product are put up in Canada, "sweetened" and "unsweetened." In making the sweetened article, 400 pounds of milk are reduced by evaporation to 100 pounds and 75 pounds of sugar added, making 175 pounds of sweetened condensed milk. The unsweetened condensed milk is simply condensed in about the same proportion. In 1900 there were but four condensed milk factories in Canada which turned out \$269,000 worth. Now there are nine or ten factories and this year their production will be worth over a million dollars. One factory at Ingersoll turns out \$1,600 worth daily. TO CROSS THE ATLANTIC IN AN AIRSHIP.

At length preparatory steps are being taken to voyage across the Atlantic through the air. To provide the ship and the money for the costly and risky experiment the Europe-America Aero Navigation Company has been formed and incorporated in New York. The promoters profess confidence not only that the attempt will be made, but that it will be successfully accomplished.

The ship will be something of the Zeppelin type, a balloon with motor power attached. The proposed route is approximately that taken by Columbus, it may be partly from sentimental reasons, but also because it affords several stopping places, and certain advantages from the trade winds. It is proposed to start at Palos, Spain, making the first stop at Madeira or Tenerife. From the Canary Islands the airship will proceed southwesterly to the Cape Verde Islands, and thence across to the Bahama Islands.

A favorable time of year will be selected, and it is thought the passage can be made in five days. It is understood that ships will be located where they can give assistance along the route, and in part to follow the airship. This provision for safety will make the experiment a costly one. It will be the work of the company to provide the funds and equip the enterprise, which, if successful, will be a very famous one. And who shall say it may not succeed?

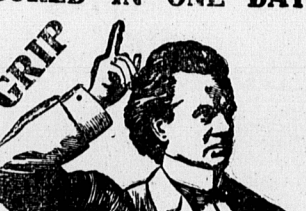
