

To Receive Degree From University



The degree of Doctor of Divinity will be conferred upon Rev. H. E. D. Ashford, of Trinity Church in this city, (above), by Queen's University, Kingston, on May 17, at the University, Rev. Mr. Ashford was informed this week by President A. W. Macintosh.

Rev. Mr. Ashford assumed duties as pastor of Trinity Church in July 1949 following a distinguished career. Born in Newcastle, N. B., he received his early education at Mount Allison University and later attended Queen's University and Union College. Following his graduation he went to British Columbia where he held two pastorates, and later he served as a missionary in India. In 1939 he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served as chaplain. Known as the "Flying Padre" he was the only chaplain to fly on active operations against the enemy. He was also the only R.C.A.F. chaplain to be decorated before the end of hostilities and served on more fronts than any other chaplain.

Prior to his arrival here he resided in Calgary, Alberta, where he was Field Secretary for Western Canada for the Missionary and Maintenance Department of the United Church of Canada.
