V-E DAY OBSERVANCE

New War Memorial To Be Unveiled At Summerside

V-E Day observances at Summerside next Sunday will feature the unveiling of a new memorial to those from the Summerside area who died in World War II, and in the Korean War.
The new memorial, costing over \$1,700, was first proposed by the Summerside branch of the Canadian Legion who have received financial assistance from firms, service clubs, and individuals, in this endeavour.
The memorial, measuring 7 feet by 3 feet, will be placed in a low, sloping position beside the cenotaph in Memorial Square in the center of Summerside, and has been inscribed with the names of 62 veterans from this area who died while in the service of their country in the two wars mentioned above.
The unveiling of this memorial will be performed by Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, M.P., parliament-ary assistant to the Minister of Fisheries, who will be present for the occasion. His Worship Mayor W.A. Currie, of Summerside, will make an address previous to the unveiling ceremony, and the program which includes the placing of a wreath and the laying of poppies, will be under the chairmanship of Lorne Monkley, president of the Summerside branch of the Canadian Legion, who will read the names on the monument during the ceremony.
The Last Post and Reveille will be sounded by Bugler Albert C. Gallant, with prayer of dedication by Rev. J. E. LeClair and benediction by Rev. J.D. MacKay. The Summerside Sea Cadet band will provide band music for the

National Anthem and the Queen, and the program at the unveiling of the memorial will begin at 12.20 p.m.
The whole program which has been arranged by a committee under the chairmanship of Earle Cannon, past president of the Summerside branch of the Canadian Legion will commence with church parades during the morning.
The parade of veterans which will assemble at the Legion Home on Water Street at 10.35 a.m., will be under the command of F. J. MacNeill, with a color party comprising Arthur Corney, Percy Ramsay, Ralph Boates and Albert Gallant. The band will be under the direction of Gabriel Chasson.
The parade will move off from the Legion Home at 10.35 a.m. west of Water Street to Summer Street, north on Summer Street to Notre Dame Street, west on Notre Dame Street to Central Street where the Roman Catholic Church party under Charles Hogan will fall out.
The Protestant party, under Earl Cannon, will continue south on Central Street to North Market Street, west on North Market Street to the Presbyterian Church.

After the church services the parade will re-group with the Sea Cadet band forming up at the corners of Church and Central Street facing east, the Protestant party will move independently from the Presbyterian Church and join the parade, while the Roman Catholic party move independently from St. Paul's Church and join the parade which will move east on Church Street to Summer Street, north on Summer Street to Memorial Square for the unveiling ceremony at the new memorial.
Afterwards the parade will move east to Spring Street, north on Spring Street to Notre Dame Street west of Notre Dame Street to Summer Street, south on Summer Street to Water Street Street.
