

Manitoba Hydro Provides Cheap Power For Province

WINNIPEG (CP) — Growing by leaps and bounds, Manitoba Hydro still is able to offer householders in the province some of the cheapest electrical power in Canada.

The government-operated company last year spent \$42,000,000 in expansion and is in the process of spending \$100,000,000 on a huge hydro development at Grand Rapids, 250 miles northwest of Winnipeg.

But still, the householders pay only 1.15 cents a kilowatt hour for power.

This compares with 1.34 cents in Ontario, 1.48 cents in Quebec and a national average of 1.81 cents that includes a high of 3.42 cents in the Yukon and the Northwest Territories.

In 1962 the provincially owned company transmitted 4,500,000,000 kilowatt hours of power to consumers, 3,800,000,000 of which was used in the southern more densely populated section.

Of the 661,000,000 kilowatt hours transmitted north, 96 per cent was used for production at the International Nickel smelting plant at Thompson.

WATER MAIN SOURCE

Working with Winnipeg city hydro, Manitoba Hydro obtained only seven per cent of the power needs of the province from other than water sources.

Of the seven per cent, three came from interchanges arrangements with Ontario and Saskatchewan, three from thermal stations and the remainder from diesel power plants.

Manitoba Hydro provided 75 per cent of the total requirement.

The Grand Rapids development on the Saskatchewan River is the largest in the province. It is to be opened in May, 1964.

Adeanuer Gives Views On Russia

 BONN (AP) — Chancellor Konrad Adeanauer says disarmament and nuclear test negotiations will be useful in the West if he is trying to persuade the Russians to change their policy so that East-West tension can be reduced.

Adeanauer, long reputed to be a hard-line Western leader in relations with Russia, said in an exclusive interview with The Associated Press in Bonn that he would welcome "reasonable discussions" with the Soviet Union.

But he warned against offering concessions unmatched by Soviet concessions of equal value.

The retiring West German government chief set forth and amplified these and other views in a long conversation at his private office in the Palais Schaumburg.

Despite his 87 years and scheduled retirement this fall, he said he still is busy.

Adeanauer expressed conviction that the recently ratified French-West German friendship pact, providing for periodic consultations between Bonn and Paris government chiefs, will serve the interests of all the Atlantic allies. He said it marks an end to 400 years of French-German hostility.

SUPPORTS UNIFICATION

He declared his support for European unification "close partnership" with the United States, thereby endorsing the main line of U.S. President Kennedy's European policy. But he emphasized his conviction that President de Gaulle of France, is firmly committed also to the alliance and that France fears to West Germany "a firm bulwark against the threat to Europe from the East."

Written answers were made to written questions submitted in advance. Here are key points covered:

Q. When you spoke before the National Press Club in Washington last Nov. 15, following the crisis over Soviet missiles in Cuba, you said the most important lesson in that crisis for the Western Allies was "... we must remain united."

A. Two months later the NATO alliance split sharply over major political and military issues. Do you believe the decisive forces within the alliance will in the long run prove to be stronger than the unifying forces?

A. We must and will remain united. The Western alliance has experienced a series of differences of opinion in past years. The alliance came through them all.

Q. We are all of us agreed that the cooperation among the European peoples must develop a close partnership with the United States of America.

A. You often have been represented, Mr. Chancellor, as one of the most unifying of Western leaders in your attitude towards attempts at agreement with the Soviet Union. Do you believe that accommodations are impossible? Under what conditions might they become possible?

A. Neither am I opposed to efforts to get along with the Soviet Union nor do I reject all accommodations. I should welcome it if the West were to enter reasonable discussions with the Soviet Union.

MAKES MOST RUBBER

Italy leads the other nations of the European Common Market in production of synthetic rubber, producing 90,000 tons in 1962.

But the provincial government is looking hard at the Nelson River with a team of engineers and geologists pouring over the territory north and west of Lake Winnipeg seeking possible sites for additional development.

Reports submitted indicated there are no apparent hindrances to development of the high-voltage lines, capable of carrying loads in excess of 200,000 volts. This is more than double the carrying capacity of any other line in the province and equalled in Canada only by a line now operating in Alberta.

The line is from Brandon to a terminal station at Rosser and will be duplicated by a line to Rosser from Grand Rapids.

But still, the needs of a power-hungry modern world never abate and by 1970 it is believed that the potential of all sources then operating in the province will be at their peak of production.

From where the further power needed will come is a continuing question that Manitoba Hydro is trying to answer through research and in conjunction with the other provinces and the federal government.

Completion of the Grand Rapids power station in 1965 will pour another 230,000 kilowatt hours of energy into the provincial power grid system.

Sugar Output Shows Drop

OTTAWA (CP) — Production of refined cane and beet sugar in May, during the flurry over sharp price increases, was 13.1 per cent below year-earlier levels.

A bureau of statistics report Tuesday also showed company-held stocks of sugar on May 31

at 245,898,000 pounds compared with 276,420,000 pounds a year earlier.

May sugar production totalled 128,128,000 pounds compared with 160,153,000 in May, 1962. But output in the first five months of the year rose 2.3 per cent to 587,024,000 pounds from 573,959,000.

The succession of sugar price increases this spring was attributed to higher world prices caused by shortages of raw sugar production.

MINUTEMAN READY

WASHINGTON (AP) — The number of combat-ready U.S. intercontinental ballistic missiles topped the 300-mark Tuesday when the air force started manning its second wing of 6,300-range Minuteman ICBMs at Ellsworth Air Force Base in southwestern South Dakota. In all, this second wing will have 150 of the solid-fuel Minutemen equipped in protected below-ground launch sites.
