The Green Pennant Express takes off

"It is often claimed that international friendship and commonwealth understanding depend on people getting to know each other and about each other's countries. If that is the case, then the COMEX expeditions are the most worthwhile programs ever to devised." ...HRH Prince Philip.

From sea to sea this summer and visiting 45 Canadian communities in all the provinces and territories, four hundred people will participate, for the first time in Canada, in a mobile con-

ference of "goodwill, peace and friendship".

The COMEX "Green Pennant Express" will consist of ten buses carrying young people across Canada to present concerts of song, dance, mime and folk stories, with the purpose of engendering community participation in this advance.

And applications are now being accepted.

The selection committee will take into consideration a person's ability to work as a member of a group, participating in concerts (if only as stage hands), discussions

and other activities.

Good health, patience, a sense of humour, and a genuine commitment to the aims and objectives of COMEX are necessary qualities for a successful expedition.

The central philosophy of the expedition is to draw on people's talents and abilities, to share their strengths and accept each other's weaknesses. COMEX believes all play a part in individuals' bringing out the best in one another.

The cost for each participant is \$1550, of which \$50

is non-refundable registration fee. The expedition will be accommodated in schools, gymnasiums, and camp grounds.

Each contingent of 40 will be given a daily allowance for food during the trip, which goes from June 20 to August 10, 1984. Groups of 10 will take turns at catering for the contingent.

Green Pennant Expresses are also running in Britain, India, and Singapore.
