Eastern Provincial Air Lines, a Newfoundland Company, took over Maritime Central Airways in a final transfer of all papers and payments of assets yesterday in St. John's, Newfoundland. Capt. Carl Burke, managing director of MCA, and Arthur Clark, secretary-treasurer, attended the conference completing the transfer.

MCA will run under its present setup and colors until the end of September.

The name of the new company operating the combined airlines will be the Eastern Provincial Airways 1963 Limited.
