Merchants At St. Pierre Strike

ST. PIERRE, ST. PIERRE ET MIQUELON (CP)—Residents of this French Colonial island off the south coast of Newfoundland couldn't buy groceries Monday. All the merchants had gone on strike.

A reliable source said the strike, unique in St. Pierre's history, was called to protest measures taken by the government, such as reduction of margins of profit, already at their rock-bottom.

The Merchants' Association and Chamber of Commerce said the strike would only last 24 hours but warned it would be followed up "if a return to peace time business procedure is not reached."

St. Pierre et Miquelon is administered by a Governor from France.

Bluenose Cuts Service Sept. 27

MONCTON (CP)—The ferry Bluenose, which operates between Yarmouth N.S. and Bar Harbor, Me. begins tri-weekly service Sept. 27, the CNR announced Monday.

The ferry makes daily round trips during the summer but under the new schedule, will leave Yarmouth Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, returning from Bar Harbor every other day.
