Registration Of Employed State To Begin April 1

OTTAWA (CP)—The federal government plans to give a number to every employed person in Canada in a system of registration for social security purposes such as pensions. National registration begins April 1 and the number system will be between 6,000,000 and 6,500,000 people who each have their own eight-digit number. The number is a pocket-sized identification card showing it. The nine digits—ranging from 100-0000 to 999-999-999—will be known as social insurance numbers. The other part of the card shows the same information, plus the former unemployment insurance number, is supposed to be put away in a safe place. The registration will be handled by the Unemployment Insurance Commission through employers. All employees—whether covered by insurance or not—will be asked to fill in special forms. Those who come under existing unemployment insurance regulations—about 5,000,000 workers—will be asked to provide their own identification number. But other employed persons—about 1,500,000 outside the scope of the present act—can not be asked to fill in the forms. "We don't intend to coerce anyone," said a UIC official. "We're relying on the goodwill and co-operation of employers and employees." The number system will not apply—at least at present—to self-employed persons or to
