DAMASCUS, Syria (Reuters)—Syrian Prime Minister said Ghazal Maj.-Gen. E. L. M. Burns of Ottawa, United Nations chief supervisor in Palestine, Tuesday said Syria does not object to his proposals for reducing tension on the Israeli border, but insisted on ensuring Syrian rights. Burns had proposed a gentlemen's agreement between Israel and Syria to avoid further clashes in the Lake Tiberias area.
