POSTSCRIPT.

Saturday, 10, A. M.

ARRIVAL OF THE ST. GEORGE. By the St. George, which arrived this morning, after part of our impression had been struck off, we have received our usual Colonial files, from which we have hastily extracted the following items of intelligence:—

A dreadful steamboat explosion, with great loss of life, had occurred on the Mississippi. The bodies of some of the victims alighted nearly 300 yards from the scene of the disaster.

BERMUDA.—Private accounts received by Mr. Keefer, from Bermuda, per the brig Daphne, which arrived here on Wednesday last, give a melancholy picture of the ravages committed by the fever which has for some time past been raging in those islands.

OUR OWN FILES by this opportunity, which are to the 23d ult. give a somewhat less sombre view of the case, as will be seen by the annexed extract; but we sincerely regret to observe in the obituary notices which they furnish, the names of Captain Wentworth, of the Royal Engineers, who, after having almost miraculously escaped with his lady and family from the wreck of the R. M. Steam Packet Solway, recently left this garrison to assume the duties assigned him at Bermuda; of Captain Robert Fenwick, also of the Royal Engineers, and a native of this City; Capt. Sir Henry Chamberlain, of the Royal Artillery; Lieut. Jenkin, of the Royal Engineers; Ensign Petherbridge, 20th Regt.; and Mr. Henry Rance, of the Naval Hospital. In the letter to Mr. Keefer, the death of Dr. Jenkins, of the Convict establishment, is also mentioned.—Halifax Guardian.

ST. JAGO.—The yellow fever was raging at St. Jago de Cuba with much violence. Several British vessels in port on the 3d ult. were unable to get to sea, for want of hands. THE YELLOW FEVER.—Is raging to a fearful extent in New Orleans. Upwards of 95 persons had died in one week. The loss occasioned by the recent fire at Kingston, Jamaica, is estimated at £200,000 to £250,000. Alexander Keith, Esq., has been elected Mayor of Halifax for the ensuing twelve months.
