

CNR Extends Fast Trains

TORONTO (CP)—The CNR celebrated Monday the first birthday of its high-speed Toronto - Montreal passenger run and said it has proved so successful it is being extended.

Officials said the 375-mile run, covered in four hours and 59 minutes, has operated at a passenger occupancy of almost 80 per cent — about double what passenger trains normally carry.

As a result, the CNR is adding a morning train to the Toronto-Montreal run to complement its late - afternoon train and is inaugurating morning and afternoon high - speed service between Montreal and Quebec City.

The 100-mile Montreal-Quebec City service, operating on the same limited - stop principle started with the first train, will take between two hours and 59 minutes and three hours and 15 minutes, depending on the train.

All trains in the new service will be called Rapidos, the name given the first high-speed train.

Press Freedom Threat Is Seen

OTTAWA (CP) — Publisher Aurele Gratton of Le Droit said here that Conservative MP Terry Nugent "is striking at the freedom of the press" in his attempt to have a Le Droit reporter brought before the Commons bar on a charge of violation of House privileges.

Mr. Nugent made a motion in the Commons Thursday that Le Droit reporter Marcel Pepin be called before the bar to be dealt with for breach of privilege.

"This motion is only a blow at the freedom of the press," said Mr. Gratton in an interview. "Must our correspondents obtain the approval of MPs before sending their news to the paper?"

Accusing Mr. Pepin of "the worst kind of yellow journalism," Mr. Nugent said the reporter had written in Le Droit Oct. 14 that the Conservatives are plotting to keep the Canadian Navy British and Protestant to keep the Irish and Roman Catholics out of it.

Mr. Nugent also said Mr. Pepin had made a scurrilous attack on him by writing that he had been directed during an attack on Defence Minister Helmer from the public gallery by retired Rear - Admiral Jeffrey Brock.

Commons Speaker Lucien Lamoureux delayed his ruling on Mr. Nugent's motion to study precedents.

His decision is expected Monday.
