## Quebec Gas Earnings Up

MONTREAL (CP) — Quebec Natural Gas Corp. announced Friday net earnings of \$2,531,412 for the year ended March 31, 1966, compared with \$1,781,979 for the corresponding period the previous year.

In a letter to shareholders the Montreal-based company said operating revenues amounted to \$34,379,532 in 1966, a 10-per-cent increase over 1965.

Earnings were equal to 57 cents per share on the 3,545,580 common shares outstanding, the report said.

## Strike Ends At Drill Co.

DERBY LINE, Vt. (AP) — A bitter, eight-week strike at Union Twist Drill Co. ended when workers accepted a new contract.

Secretary Dale Austin of Local 1829, International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers said "We're going back as a body on Monday."

The vote was 91 to 84 in favor of acceptance.

About 270 workers went on strike at the Butterfield division plant Feb. 28. Picket lines were maintained throughout the strike and there were incidents of rock-throwing and minor plant damage when about 30 workers and oil delivery trucks attempted to cross picket lines.

The plant straddles the U.S.-Canadian border.

Workers on the Canadian side were prohibited by Canadian law from striking until after a 60-day cooling off period.

That period would have been over May 2, and the Canadians had scheduled a strike vote but then accepted a new contract.

## CONSIDERS MOSCOW VISIT

OTTAWA (CP) — External Affairs Minister Martin said Thursday he hopes to accept an invitation from Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko to visit Russia. He didn't say in the Commons external affairs committee when he plans to go.

Informants said he may go in July.

OTTAWA (CP) — Firemen evacuated office workers from the seven-storey Henry Birks Building on Sparks Street when a fire, which started in the basement, filled the higher floors with smoke. They returned a short time later when the fire was brought under control.
