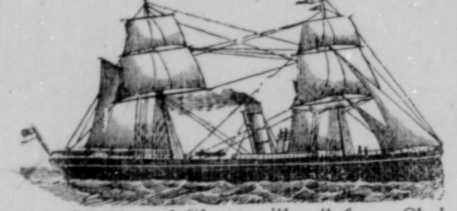

The Domestic German Girl.

An important part of a girl's education in Germany is her instruction in domestic science. She is taught how to knit and darn stockings, and how to repair towels and bed and table linen skilfully. She crochets lace and other things, and makes all kinds of cross-stitch work. Most German girls of the upper classes have some musical education. As a rule, they play better on the piano than they sing. After the girl has finished her school course she goes to a boarding house of the better class to learn how to cook, and keep house, and to acquire the ways of refined society outside of her own home. Here she remains for several months and watches the process of the cooking and other work, often lending a hand herself. It will be seen that her education presupposes that she will marry some time in her life, and it is in a measure a preparation for that event. Consequently, when she has been confirmed she begins to prepare her trousseau. She crochets lace, makes table-covers, works long tidies, in cross-stitch, and by degrees collects a large supply of towels and bed and table linen. Everything that is available is put away in the chest holding her treasures.—Ladies Home Journal.

Delicate Dishes for Cabbage Lovers.

To cook lady's cabbage remove the outside leaves from a good, hard head of cabbage, cut it into halves, then into quarters, and chop rather fine. Throw it into boiling salted water, allow the water to come quickly to boiling point, then place the kettle, uncovered, where it will simmer, not boil, for twenty minutes. Drain; return the cabbage to the kettle; add to each quart of the cooked cabbage (which you can easily measure with the eye) a tablespoonful of butter, half a cupful of milk or cream, and a quarter of a teaspoonful of pepper. Stir until it reaches the boiling point, and serve at once.

A very pretty and palatable dish may be made by cutting the cabbage into eighths; throw these into boiling salted water, and bring to the boiling point; simmer, never boil, until the cabbage is transparent and white; this will take about thirty minutes. Drain; arrange on a round dish, one piece overlapping the other. Pour over half a pint of cream sauce, dust lightly with finely chopped parsley, and serve at once.

The Linen Collar.

The linen collar is with us always as a boon and a friend, ready to serve at a moment's notice when there is a dearth of something else just suitable. Nothing is more becoming to many women, nothing so enhances fairness or freshness of complexion or rejuvenates a rather passe suit—yet many men do not like to see women wear linen collars for two reasons; first because so many affect the extreme styles, too tall or too something else, and too many will wear a linen collar the second time.

When you do this you ruin all, for a spotless immaculacy is the chief recommendation for plain, white linen, and there is a certain something gone after the first few hours, even if it is not actually soiled—so, unless you intend never to wear it a second time without a trip to the laundry—banish the linen collar from your wardrobe. The Servant Problem.

The Housekeepers Alliance of Philadelphia, is making its first practical endeavor to solve the servant problem by establishing a school for the training of domestics. A suit of rooms has been selected, and the beginning is to be made with a class of ten. The new quarters were formally opened this month. The idea of instituting an alliance first originated in the social science department of the Civic Club and some of the most earnest members of the club are to be identified with this special work. Every possible branch of domestic labor will be fully considered. One plan now under discussion is to establish a first-class cafe, all the "help" to be pupils of the alliance, even to the waitresses who will serve the dishes prepared by cooks. The proceeds are to be used in the interest of the alliance. Tuition will be moderate.—Chicago Times Herald.

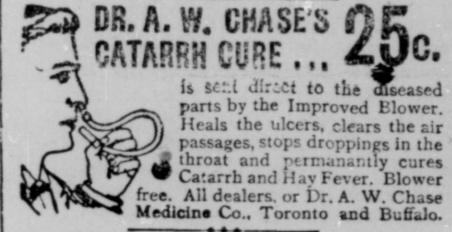
