Civil Service—Increases of Salary.

OTTAWA, Jan. 13.—General increases in the salaries of the civil service will not take place this year, although it is likely there will be a larger amount given than last year. Increases will, however, be given for meritorious work, on the recommendation of the Deputy Heads.

Advices from Dawson City, dated December 18th, were received here today by telegraph from Victoria. This is the quickest time on record. Fully one thousand men are coming out to the coast with gold or claims to sell. Rich strikes are reported at Sulphur and Hunker Creeks.

Mr. Tarte has given Ahearn & Soper, of Ottawa, the contract for electric fire apparatus and wiring and lighting by electricity of all the departmental buildings at Ottawa for about \$65,000.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

LONDON, Jan. 11.—The Cairo correspondent of the Daily Chronicle says: It is the belief here that the British operations are due to the presence of the French at Fashada rather than to the Dervish advance. The Dervish movement is hampered by lack of transport, but it is believed that 40,000 Dervishes are covering Omdurman, opposite Khartoum, and 20,000 more are at Metemeh and Shendi (between 80 and 90 miles northwest of Omdurman). It is estimated that one-eighth are armed with rifles.

goods imported and entered in transit and shipped by water from one port to another port in the dominion. The design of the regulations is to enable ports where such goods are entered, and whence they are shipped, to be advised that they have been duly received and delivered into the custody of the customs at the port where they are to be conveyed by water.

LONDON, Jan. 12.—A special despatch from Shanghai says it is reported there that Mr. McLean Brown, British superintendent of Korean customs, has been offered the British consul generalship at Seoul, the Korean capital, and that the Russo-Japanese agreement as to Korea involves the recognition of Port Lazareff, on the sea coast north Gensan, as within the sphere of Russian influence.

OTTAWA, Jan. 11.—Canadian manufacturers of electrical machinery are up in arms against Tarte for his latest exhibition of the "Business is business" principal. Pilcher, representing the Canadian General Electric Light, of Peterboro, was in Ottawa to day with the minister of public works regarding the supplying of electrical machinery for the government buildings. Tarte has given an order for four Westinghouse 40-horse power electric motors and four Worthington pumps at a cost of nearly \$30,000, to an Ottawa firm, Ahearn and Soper, without tender, although when the matter was under discussion in the house last session the minister promised positively that the government would ask for tenders. Tarte's action is all the more surprising, when it is remembered that the Canadian General Electric Company is composed almost entirely of leading liberals.

OTTAWA, Jan. 11.—Application was filed with the Minister of the Interior today by E. O. Davis & Co., of New York, for the purchase of one mile on either bank of the White river from the United States boundary to Yukon. This is a preliminary step to securing authority to build a Railway to Dawson if they got the grant.

MONTREAL, Jan. 11.—The Star's London correspondent cables: Dr. Borden sails for home to-morrow. The statement is published that he has arranged with the war office for an elaborate rearrangement of Canadian defences, including new depot for British troops at Vancouver and elsewhere on the Pacific coast, and much armament. It is officially stated, however that while Borden naturally discussed the latest necessities of Canada's defence, no elaborate plans of this kind are in view. The fact of credence being given to the statement shows Canada's growing importance from an Imperial standpoint, in view of the coming struggle between England, Russia, Japan, and America for supremacy on the Pacific. Great interest is taken in the fact learned here, though not publicly announced, that the government will make radical changes in the Yukon mining regulations. It is urged that a definite announcement will be made at the earliest moment. Dr. D. McEichren, chief veterinary inspector of the Dominion is here. It is understood he has hopes of inducing the board of agriculture to remove the schedule from Canadian cattle. That is most impracticable. Not even Chamberlain, can act against the interests, supposed or real, of the British farmer.
