Charles Cornell of Toronto, general manager of the Packaging Association of Canada, agreed that glass bottles are out of date. He suggested also that home deliveries of milk be scrapped, with the consumer getting his supplies from stores.

However, J. A. Chartrand of Montreal, member of the Quebec Milk Commission, disagreed. He urged continuance of home deliveries emphasizing that many mothers and other sick persons who can not get to stores would suffer.

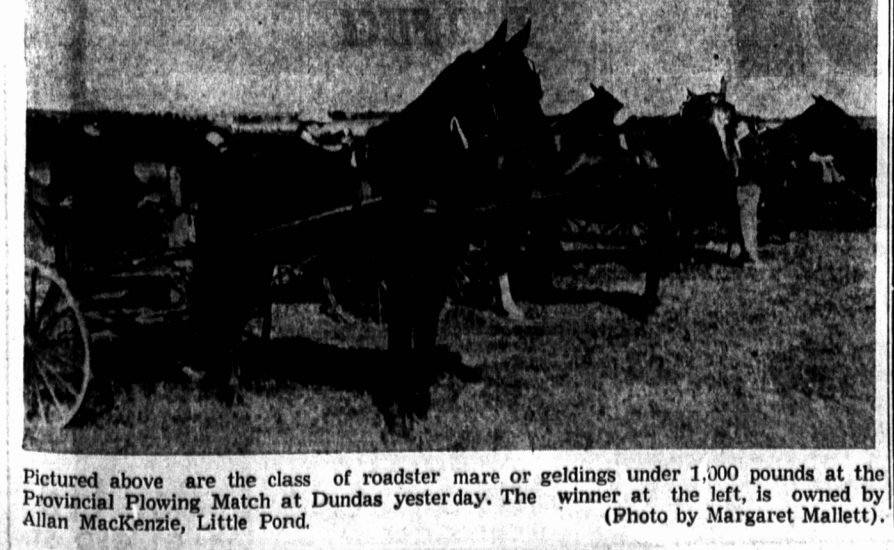
