

**PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE.**

MONDAY, May 2.

House met at 4.15. Mr. Wise presented a bill incorporating the Fruit Growers' Association of Prince Edward Island, which was referred to the Private Bills Committee.

Hon. Mr. Gordon then moved the following resolution:

Resolved, that a humble address be presented to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, praying that copies of all plans and specifications for the construction of a new Prince of Wales College be laid on the table of the Legislative Assembly; and also copies of all tenders and the names of the tender accepted; also all papers and correspondence between the persons tendering and the Government, the name of person or persons from whom plans and specifications were obtained, the amount paid or agreed to be paid for each plan and specification respectively, the name of the person appointed inspector and a copy of the agreement entered into by the Government with the said inspector, and the amount agreed to be paid for services of said inspector.

And also the plans and copies of all specifications and also copies of all tenders for the construction of a new wing or addition to the Hospital for the Insane at Falconwood, the name of tender accepted and also a copy of the bond and agreement between the Government and the person whose tender was accepted also all papers and correspondence between the person whose tender was accepted and the Government, also a copy of all reports reports relating to the aforesaid wing or addition the names of the person or persons from whom plans and specifications were obtained, the amount paid or agreed to be paid for each plan and specification respectively, the name of the person appointed inspector and a copy of the agreement entered into by the Government with said inspector, and the amount paid or agreed to be paid for services of said inspector, and also

A statement showing how the item of \$787.70 as shown in the Public Accounts, 1897, and charged to expenses February Term, Georgetown Supreme Court is made up, the amount paid to each person, the services rendered by each person, and the names of the persons receiving payment respectively; and also how the item of \$1883.94 as shown in the Public Accounts of 1897 and charged to Roads, Queen's, Prince and King's counties and Inquisitions on new roads is made up, the names of the persons to whom payments were made, the amount paid to each person, the nature of the work done and the name of the road or

locality and county respectively in which work was done. And also a statement showing in detail the amount expended on Souris Beach between the 1st of May and the 31st of December, 1897, the names of the persons employed, the dates when said persons were so employed, the number of days each person was so employed, the amount paid per day to each person so employed respectively, the number of persons so employed the number of horses so employed, the names of the persons furnishing said horses, the amount paid per day for service of each horse, and the number of days that each horse was so employed respectively, the amount and nature of material used, the amount paid for material and the names of the persons furnishing materials, and the amount paid to each person for said material respectively.

Mr. Shaw seconded the motion, and was proceeding to point out that the Opposition had been driven to this course by the persistent refusal of the Government to answer the questions put upon the order book when Hon. Mr. Warburton arose and objected to further discussion claiming that the resolution had not been properly tabled and was therefore not regularly before the House.

The Speaker sustained the objection of the Premier and ruled the resolution out of order.

Hon. Mr. McLean tabled a return giving an itemized account of the miscellaneous expenditure in the Public Works Department.

Hon. Mr. Warburton presented returns of the disbursements for the Supreme Court at Charlottetown and Summerside, a return of the expenditure charged to Alexandria school district, and a statement in connection with Boards of Health.

On motion of Mr. Sinclair the bill incorporating the Stanley Bridge Foresters Hall Company was read a third time and passed.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Rogers the bill to facilitate the liquidation of the affairs of the Charlottetown Gas Light Company was read a third time and passed.

On motion of Hon. H. C. Macdonald the bill incorporating the Farmers Institute of Cherry Valley was read a second time in committee, Mr. Peters in the chair. Progress reported.

Hon. Mr. McLean presented the original plan of the Hospital for the Insane; also a copy of the specification.

House adjourned until 10 a. m. Tuesday, TUESDAY, May 3.

House met at 4.15. Mr. McKinnon presented a bill amending the act incorporating the Murray Harbor Dairying Company. Referred to Private Bills Committee.

Mr. Birch asked the Leader of the Government to table, in detail, a statement of the exhibition held in Alberton in the fall of 1897, the amount of prize money offered and the amount of prize money paid out, the name of each person receiving a prize and the amount of such prizes, and also a statement showing the balance on hand.

Hon. Mr. Warburton promised the information in a day or two.
