MR. PRICE, M. P. P. for Chicoutimi, Que., has resigned his seat owing to ill-health.

COUNT RADOWITZ has been appointed German ambassador to Paris, in place of Prince Hohenlohe.

VICTOR HUGO's 78th birthday was celebrated with great eclat in Paris, on the 26th February.

RUSSIA is said to be in negotiation for an alliance with France, in view of future war with Germany.

THE mails crossed to and from Cape Traverse to-day, (Thursday); and the mails for this city arrived at 3 p. m.

A MUSICAL and literary entertainment takes place at Fort Augustus Chapel on Monday evening next.

PROF. ANDERSON lectures on "Macbeth" in St. Patrick's Hall to-morrow evening.

SIR STAFFORD NORTHCOTT'S resolution against the Obstructionists has been passed by the British House of Commons.

A LONDON despatch states that General Stewart's advance upon Ghuzni will probably commence about March 31st.

THE St. John Telegraph reports a "good beginning" in the shipment of lumber from New Brunswick to Europe this year.

A LARGE number of persons have expressed a desire to go from Ottawa to the Northwest as soon as the spring sets in.

THE New York Herald's fund on Friday night amounted to \$254,114. The Herald will probably not stop short of \$300,000.

MR. PARNELL, the Irish agitator, has a brother living at West Point, Ga., who is a famous fruit grower, and owns an orchard containing fifty thousand peach trees.

A DOUBLE collision occurred on the Intercolonial Railway, near Taetaeta Station, on the 31st ult. The engines and cars were considerably damaged. No person hurt.

OVER eighteen hundred immigrants arrived in seven European steamers at New York, on the 28th ult., mostly of the better class of refugees from famine stricken Ireland.

IT is said the Duke of Edinburgh, who lately arrived at St. Petersburg to attend the ceremonies on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the Czar's accession to the throne, is endeavoring to induce the Czar to abdicate.

THE New York Herald's Relief Committee have already commenced operations in Dublin with a fund which has already reached \$250,000, and which will probably be doubled.

THE mover of the address, in answer to the Governor's Speech, in the Nova Scotia Assembly, dwelt strongly on the claim of Nova Scotia to a fair share of the Fishery Award, and produced statistics in reference to the matter which are said to be very convincing.

THE trial of Davitt, Daly, Killen and Brennan seems to have commenced. Other matters have recently so much overshadowed the disorderly proceedings in which they took part that nearly all interest in their case has died out.

THE St. Gothard Tunnel is practically finished, only twenty-two metres remaining unpierced. Since the St. Denis Tunnel was completed, the accomplishment even of so stupendous a work as the St. Gothard Tunnel excites little remark.

THE distress in Ireland continues to be very great. The details given in the N. Y. Herald's special despatches, in regard to the County of Donegal, reveal widespread suffering. The Herald's distribution committee are at work, and with other agencies, are doing much for the destitute.

THE Dublin Freeman's Journal, heretofore a staunch supporter of Mr. Parnell, now denounces him for alleged libels on other relief funds than his own. Mr. Parnell, who is at Dubaque, Iowa, replied to the Freeman in a speech, and it is predicted that when Parnell returns to Ireland a "formidable row" will take place between he and his former associates.

To correct a misprint in yesterday's issue, we again publish the following paragraph from the annual report of the Bank of P. E. Island:—

But the evil effects of the financial crisis of former years have continued to be felt, chiefly in the depreciation of the assets of estates indebted to this Bank, which were, when we last met, in the course of liquidation, and from which larger dividends were, with good reason, anticipated, than those, which subsequent depressing circumstances, have compelled the institution to accept.

Your Directors have, as the result, and after a very careful review of the general loans of the Bank, felt themselves called upon to write off, for bad and doubtful debts, the sum of \$3,527.04, only \$475.00 of which, however, have occurred in connexion with the business proper of this last year. This still left a balance of \$1,763.31 of last year's profits to be added to the former balance of profits on hand to the credit side of the account.

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

Special Dispatch to the Examiner.

LONDON, March 3.

Grissell, in accordance with the motion agreed to yesterday, was brought to the bar of the House of Commons to-day, when he read a most humble apology. Northcote, amidst cheers, moved his committal to Newgate, and the motion was adopted without debate or division.

The Standard says in reference to the allocation of the six vacant seats in the House of Commons, that Dublin, Cork Co., Bristol, Sheffield and the Metropolitan constituency will each receive an additional member. The claims of Yorkshire are being considered for the sixth seat.

An election took place at Dreggheda yesterday to fill the seat in the Commons made vacant by the death of O'Leary, Home Ruler. Whitworth, Liberal, was elected.

ST. PETERSBURG, March 3.

General Melikoff, Chief of the new Executive Commission, was fired at by a student with a revolver this afternoon, when alighting from his carriage at his residence in Grand Moskva. Gen. Melikoff was not seriously hurt. The culprit, who feigns insanity, was seized by the Cossacks.

The Duke of Edinburgh, all high officials, and many others have congratulated Melikoff on his escape from assassination to-day.

After the morning serenade on Tuesday, the Czar held a reception at which the officers of the Imperial suite, and higher grades of the army were present. At noon there was a solemn procession to the palace church, the Czar escorting the Czarina.

OTTAWA, March 3.

At the Dominion Rifle Association meeting held this morning, and which was largely attended, Col. Gzowski in the chair. A resolution of thanks to the Governor-General was moved by Lieut. Col. Kirkpatrick, and seconded by Col. Laurie. A resolution of thanks to the Princess Louise was moved by Mr. Caron, M. P., seconded by J. W. McDonald, of Victoria, B. C.

The Marquis of Lorne, in reply said that it was his will and request that his annual gift should be increased from £50 stg., to £100 stg., to be given in the name of the Princess and himself, to be devoted to prizes for competition, with the limitation that none of it must go to competitors using the back position.

Dunville moved a vote of thanks to Mr. Masson, late Minister of Militia, for his donation of \$200, and it was seconded by Lieut. Col. Bergin.

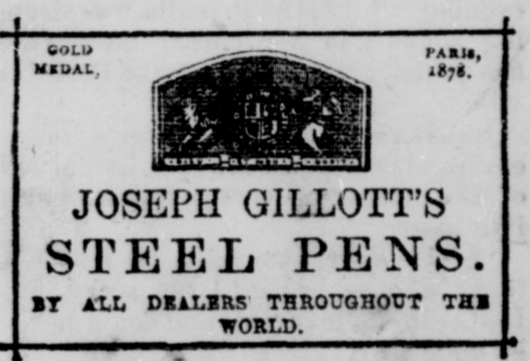
