The corner stone of a new convent at Buctouche was laid on Tuesday with appropriate ceremonies.

THE FIRE IN PORTLAND—Incendiarism is said to be the cause of the terrible conflagration in Portland which we chronicled to day.

The steamer "M. A. Starr" arrived from Halifax on Saturday morning and sailed in the evening. The "Miramichi" touched at this port on Saturday night.

STEAMER SUNK.—The steamer *Knappton Hall*, of London, was, by collision, sunk at sea on the 19th. Twelve lives were lost.

\$500 DAMAGES.—The libel suit of Wordsworth vs the Halifax *Chronicle* has been concluded. The jury in the case returned a verdict, finding the plaintiff not guilty of any of the charges and fixing damages at \$50.

A LARGE FLEET FOR P. E. ISLAND.—The shipping despatch to the Halifax "Chronicle" from Cape Causo, reports the sailing of upwards of one hundred and twenty vessels from that port for Prince Edward Island. All are, we presume, to load with produce.

COL. FRANK BOND, son of the Dean of Montreal, a prominent business man of that city, and John Campbell, Commercial Editor of the *Daily Herald*, were arrested on the 19th, for conspiracy against the City and District Savings Bank. Other arrests are probable.

On Saturday morning, about five o'clock, a man named O'Donohoe, who was wending his way, in a state of drunkenness, on board the *Pictou* boat, fell over the outer entrance and would have been drowned were it not for the timely assistance of some of the boat's crew. He was taken to the police station, and at 10 o'clock fined \$2 for his carelessness.

Schr. *Adeaptandum*, Log. 54 1/2 28 min. Lat. 49 35 min. Schooner sinking. Three days without provisions. Capt. washed overboard last night. God help us. O. Mickenort, Second Mate. Sunday, 16th Sept., 1877.—S. Progress.

At the Stipendiary Magistrate's Court on Saturday morning, John Carter and Mary Hennessey were each fined \$3 and costs or 14 days, for being drunk and incapable. Robert McLean, William Cole, Patrick McNamara, and Patrick O'Donohoe, were each fined \$2 and costs or 8 days for the same offence. John Smith, alias Jimmey McGuire, was fined \$6 or one month, for being drunk and disorderly. Restored case of Duncan McMillan, for selling liquor on the Sabbath, was dismissed.

DEPARTURE OF THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS.—At the regular meeting of the members of the St. Patrick's Total Abstinence Society, held in St. Patrick's Hall last evening, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:—

**CITY COUNCIL.**

A meeting of the City Council was held on Saturday evening. A bye-law providing for a tax of \$50 on Commercial Travelers passed a first and second reading, and the following resolution was introduced by Councillor Harris for consideration:—

Whereas, it is the duty of the City Council to use the strictest economy in every department of the civic service, with the view of keeping down taxation to the lowest possible point consistent with the efficiency of the different branches of the civic service; and

Whereas, there is no practical use to the City of the following officers, viz: City Collector, Civil Engineer, and Inspector of Bread; and

Whereas, the duties of the City Treasurer are reduced to merely an ordinary bank account; Therefore Resolved, that the office of City Collector be transferred to the City Clerk at a salary of fifty cents per annum, and that the office of Civil Engineer and Bread Inspector be abolished; and that the salary of the City Treasurer be twenty dollars per annum.

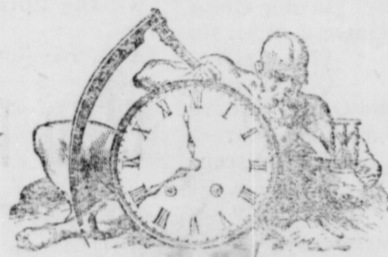

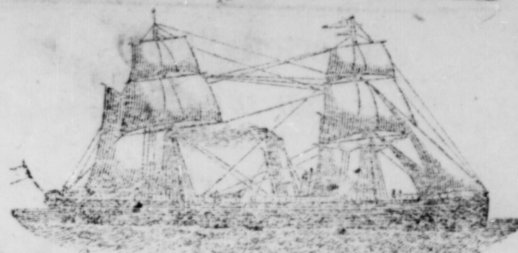
