Comments On More Preachers From The Maritime Provinces

TORONTO (CP) — A former moderator of the United Church of Canada says if the Maritime provinces produce more preachers than the rest of the country it's probably because the Atlantic coast has "so robust an inheritance."

Very Rev. Clarence M. Nicholson put forth the comment in an article in the Observer, the church newspaper, which had asked him why he thought the Maritimes were such a strong exporter of United Church clerical personnel. This year, for example, fewer than one-tenth of the nation's United Church families live in the Maritimes but Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick supply one-fifth of all the ministers in Canada.

Dr. Nicholson, principal of Pine Hill Divinity Hall at Halifax, said one reason for the above-average production might be that "the communities of the Atlantic provinces have the kind of inheritance that produces preachers; and while the college tries to develop the native strains, it is with the awareness that knowledge of superficial techniques does not make a preacher."

However, he added, the school felt "it does help to open the mouth and look he congregation in the eye."

Again, "the United Church down by the eastern sea is predominantly English-Scots and Methodist-Prbyterian in complexion—with a sweetening of Welsh and

Irish." The onetime moderator said the English Methodists who immigrated to British North America in the late 18th century "not only brought the fervent religion of the warm heart but also that certain instinct for literature and learning that belonged to the English background."

From the Presbyterian Scots, Maritimers got a "tradition of sound learning, theological aptitude and reverence for the church," and he added, "it is sometimes forgotten that the highland strain which had so large a place in Maritime Presbyterianism possessed an evangelical and a mystical character which are necessary qualities in great preaching."

The church schools of today on the east coast enjoyed a close bond with the church and faculty members often preached from pulpits here and there on Sundays. It must be remembered that these traditions have been nurturing here longer than in other parts of Canada, in an atmosphere where the winds of secularism have blown less violently than elsewhere.

For about two centuries a way of life has been going forward in a setting of wondrous beauty in quiet balleys and small towns, where one can hardly quite get away from the sound and smell of the great ocean at our door.

It is not quiet so difficult," Dr. Nicholson observed, "to listen to the voice of God."

Found Guilty In Real Estate Deal

TORONTO (CP) — Real estate broker George H. Ridout was convicted Thursday of infringement of the Real Estate and Business Brokers Act and given the option of fines totalling \$12,000 or six months in jail.

Ridout was found guilty on 12 separate counts involving the removal of \$123,400 from the trust account of the firm he headed until it entered bankruptcy some months ago. The company had been described as one of the largest real estate operations in North

America. Ridout appealed through his lawyer for three weeks in which to raise the money for his fines. Magistrate Thomas Elmore said he found the defendant's evidence "very evasive."
