Sent To Supreme Court On Breaking, Entering Charge

In county magistrate's court in Summerside yesterday morning before Magistrate R. S. Hinton, the preliminary hearing of Carl Woodside, charged with breaking and entering with intent to commit theft was concluded, and the accused was committed to stand trial at the next sitting of the Supreme Court.

The charge arose out of a break at the general store of W. H. Burns, Baltic, on or about March 9th.

In evidence taken from four witnesses for the crown, during yesterday's preliminary hearing, it appears that Mr. Burns departed for Summerside earlier on the day of the alleged break, and left an employee in charge of store and dwelling, the dwelling being located above the store, and in the same building.

Next morning the two men in the Burns home discovered foot prints in the snow leading up to the window of a warehouse adjoining the store but no tracks led away from the window, in which two panes of glass and the wooden sash had been broken in.

Mr. Harold Goodwin, crown prosecutor, reported to the crown while J. A. Gallant represented the accused.—S.
