Premier Chou Holding Talks With Ben Bella

ALGIERS (Reuters) - Communist Chinese Premier Chou En-lai met Monday night for a second session of talks with President Ahmed Ben Bella and other Algerian leaders.
The neo-communist newspaper Alger Republic said in an editorial Monday peaceful coexistence must become more and more the rule among nations.
But it did not mean countries would be prevented from fighting for independence if that was their wish.
These were two of the arguments used by Russian Premier Khrushchev in an interview published here on the eve of Chou's arrival.

HEART OF DISPUTE

The interpretation of "peaceful coexistence" is at the heart of the ideological dispute between the Russian and the Chinese Communist parties.
Alger Republic said China was for Algerians a wonderful example of what a formerly poverty-stricken nation could do under a Socialist regime.
That was why Algeria was trying to reinforce its ties of solidarity and to develop co-operation with China and other Socialist countries.

Burton-Taylor Wedding Set For Jan. Date

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico (Reuters) - Actor Richard Burton intends to marry Elizabeth Taylor by Jan. 20 at a civil ceremony "somewhere in Mexico," he said reporters Monday.
The Jewish ceremony will follow when the couple have fulfilled the necessary religious requirements. Miss Taylor adopted the Jewish faith when she married the late producer Mike Todd.

The wedding will not be in this easy-going fishing village because of legal complications arising from Burton's divorce from Sybil Burton, his wife of 13 years.
Burton told reporters during a three-quarter-mile stroll from his hilltop home to a waterfront bar that a primary settlement between Miss Taylor and her current husband, Eddie Fisher, was imminent.
This would clear the way for a divorce, but the actual suit was not expected before Jan. 15 or 16.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) - An angry Eddie Fisher said Monday he doesn't want to spoil Elizabeth Taylor's "record of getting everything she wants."
"She deserves it all," said Miss Taylor's estranged husband, "and she especially deserves Richard Burton."
"I want them to have all the happiness in the world—but I don't want to be part of that happiness. I've tried to handle this whole thing with a little bit of honor and dignity."
"It's a terrible situation and I don't want to be a part of it. All I want is a divorce. I'm tired of being made the heavy in this thing. I'm fed up."
"I think there is more trouble talking down there than anything else. My talking art comes from anger, not technique."

Young Woman Charged In Gang Robbery

MONTREAL (CP) - An attractive young blonde woman was charged Monday as an accessory after the fact of a brutal robbery carried out by three suspected members of a gang that staged a series of violent crimes in Quebec and Ontario.
Mrs. Denise Hebert, 24, of Montreal, was charged with obstructing justice by attempting to conceal \$1,400 of the \$15,300 stolen in a Nov. 28 robbery at the home of Emile Sauvagein in St. Marc des Carrières near Quebec City.
The thieves were Jean-Guy Davaud, 30, Michel Callee, 21, and Jean Fardeau, 37, all of Montreal, were earlier charged with the robbery.
